Lampasas County Youth Livestock Show

The 2023 Lampasas County Youth Livestock Show began this morning

This morning brought the rabbit check in at 7am and the show immediately followed. After the Grand & Reserve Champion Breeding Rabbits, was PeeWee Showmanship.

The Fastest Torch contest took place beginning at 9am. The way it worked was In each round, students lit their own torch, adjusted to a neutral flame, and made the cut required in that round.

Regulators were pre-set by contest officials. The student whose metal fell to the ground first, advanced to the next round. The other student will be eliminated. As the contest progressed, contestants were expected to make cuts on pipe, angle iron, I-beam, channel iron, etc.

After that at 10am, broiler check in began with the show immediately following. Noon to 1pm will be the food fair check in and at 1pm the food fair judging begins as well as the Ag Mechanics show. From 4-6pm will be the swine weigh-in and check-in. At 5pm is the food fair awards immediately followed by the Ag Mechanics Awards, and 5pm-6:30pm begins the market lambs weigh-in, followed by market goats and then breeding goats. At 6pm today there will be an exhibitor meeting in the show ring and by 7pm all animals with the exception of cattle must be in place (all tack for cattle exhibitors must be in place).

Friday will begin the Swine Show, the Market Lamb show and the Goat Show.

Sales Tax Rebates

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced yesterday he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts 1.07 Billion dollars in local sales tax allocations for January. That is up 7.6% from last year. These allocations are based on sales made in November by businesses.

In our area, Evant in Hamilton County saw their rebate increase 22.11% over the same period last year, with a \$6050.04 rebate. The City of Hamilton saw a 3.34% decrease over the same period last year in their rebate check of \$64,869.29.

In Lampasas County, Lampasas shows their rebate is up 6.58% in their check of \$240,480.64. Lometa shows an increase of 8.65% from last year with a rebate check for \$9181.99 and Kempner received a rebate for \$13,486.08, a 19.97% increase from last year.

Homeless Coalition Looking for Volunteers

A story from KXXV tells us that The Central Texas Homeless Coalition is looking for volunteers to assist in a multi-county effort to assess the size of the homeless population.

The "point in time" count will take place on January 26th and is set to take place between 6am and 7pm, though volunteers are not required to assist all day.

The coalition, which counts in Bell, Coryell, Hamilton and Lampasas counties, is in need of roughly 50 more volunteers as of Tuesday evening.

Coalition president Bobby Ehrig explained the count has an impact on the federal funding received locally to assist those experiencing homelessness and poverty.

"We want to provide the most updated data of the snapshot of our homelessness so that our federal elected officials can make decisions on funding, housing vouchers and those types of things," Ehrig said.

Volunteers do not need to meet any particular experience, and will undergo brief training before the count date.

Egg Prices too High

According to an article by Axios, while grocery items have broadly gotten more expensive, no food item has been impacted by inflation as much as eggs and their prices often give a clue about the current economic environment.

That's because eggs are not only an ingredient in many other foods and meals, they're also the product of other food sources, Axios' Hope King writes.

Egg prices were on average \$4.63 for a dozen Midwest large eggs Friday down from \$5.46 in the days before and after Christmas, according to Urner Barry's Egg Index. That's more than a gallon of gas in many parts of the country.

.Midwest large eggs — the benchmark for eggs sold in their shells — were \$5.13 Tuesday and dropped to \$4.98 Wednesday, then \$4.78 Thursday before dropping again Friday, Urner Barry's data shows.

A dozen large eggs cost approximately \$1.50 in early January 2022 and 94 cents in January 2021, the research firm found.

The bird flu outbreak, the worst in U.S. history, and consumer demand have also driven up prices. The avian influenza outbreak that began in February 2022, has killed approximately 60 million birds, which includes 41 million commercial egg-laying hens, Karyn Rispoli, editor of the Egg Price Current for Urner Barry, told Axios.

Meanwhile, wholesale prices are now starting to retreat from December as we move past the holiday baking season and high holiday demand, said Brian Moscogiuri, a global trade strategist at Eggs Unlimited, an egg supplier based in Irvine, California. Egg prices at stores might take longer to drop because retail pricing often lags the wholesale market, Moscogiuri told Axios.
