## The Weather

**Today:** All the markings of a short sleeve shirt day are upon us with the temperature rising since midnight and the forecast calling for a high of 82° this afternoon. That, in spite of the moisture in the air and a 30% chance of a morning shower and patchy early morning fog. The wind is S-SW between 10-15 mph.

**Tonight:** The rain chances are 70% after midnight as the leading edge of a cold front begins its push into the area. It will be cloudy with a low around 55° and the south wind of 10-15 mph will start its shift, becoming westerly and gust to 25 mph after midnight.

**Thursday:** Cloudy again, with a 20% chance of rain before 9am, then cloudy and gradually becoming sunny with a high near 61°. The W-NW wind of 15-20 mph will become north in the afternoon and very gusty.

Overnight Thursday will be cloudy with N-NE wind 10-15 mph and gusting and the low will drop to about 31°.

**Rest of the week:** Friday it will be cold, with a 30% chance of showers and sleet in the afternoon and a high of only 38° in the afternoon. Friday night will continue with the chance of sleet or rain, cold NE wind and a low of about 32°.

Saturday will see a 20% rain chance and slightly warmer, topping out at  $44^{\circ}$  in the afternoon as the front passes through and the wind shifts to easterly. ## Texas Sales Tax Revenue Totaled \$2.8 Billion in January



(AUSTIN) — Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar today said state sales tax revenue totaled \$2.8 billion in January, 6 percent more than in January 2018.

"The growth in sales tax collections was primarily due to continued strong spending in oil and gas-related sectors," Hegar said.

"Remittances from restaurants also grew, while those from retail trade were flat relative to a year ago."

The sales tax is the largest source of state funding for the state budget, accounting for 57% of all tax revenue. Though the above statement




