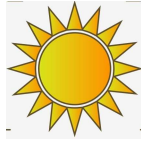

Change is coming to “The Great Place”

Fort Hood has served our nation for over 78 years and has been called “The Great Place”. Many of our veterans have served and trained there and gone on to defend our country.

Now Fort Hood is looking at having to change the name of the post. However, the name is associated with the illustrious history, contributions and sacrifices that many whom served there have made.

On the 1st of January 2021 the National Defense Authorization Act was passed which mandates the name changing of ten U.S. military installations which are named after Confederate leaders. This change must be made before 2024.

One of the ten installations is Fort Hood, named after Confederate General John B. Hood.

This movement has gained a lot of support in renaming the Army's largest installation after a native Texan and World War II hero Audie L. Murphy. You could think of him as one of the Army's finest soldier after being decorated with 38 citations and awards including every military combat award for valor available from the U.S. Army, as well as French and Belgian awards for heroism, and including the US Medal of Honor.

The installations must brief Congress on their progress by October, and have a detailed plan on what assets will be removed or renamed along with the total cost it will take to do this.

Many people are for this change but there are many who do not support this change and think it is destroying a historical land mark of our nation and a waste of resources. Is this absolutely necessary or is this another way we are throwing away money? We'll let you be the judge on that....

Out in the county there were livestock/animal issues, a mental health call, medical calls, civil matters and a reported theft. Deputies went into Cove on a civil matter, a reported criminal mischief, an animal issue, and a requested welfare check

The weather right now in Texas is not unusual, but our readiness is suspect. Temperatures are rising to levels that also raise the eyebrows of electric companies and their regulators. With air conditioners running almost full time, demand for electricity is alarmingly close to supply. That raises the prospect of brownouts, when the power cycles on and off in parts of the state to cut demand, and blackouts, when the power shuts down completely. That's not a happy situation in normal times, but after hundreds of Texans were killed by statewide blackouts during a winter storm in February, people are jittery — for perfectly understandable reasons. Many Texans had no electricity for more than half a week at a time when outside temperatures were well below freezing. People died, some from the cold and some from ill-fated attempts to stay warm. The rest of us lost faith in the state's electric grid — in the ability of the people who operate and regulate the electric industry in Texas to keep the power on when it's most needed.

But this week, everybody has had their eyes on ERCOT — the Electric Reliability Council of Texas — again — to watch a daily competition between the amount of electricity available and the amount of electricity demanded. They're rooting for "available," too aware after February of the scary things that can happen when demand wins the race and Texans who need power can't get it. Texans are distracted by thoughts of losing the flow of electricity that runs our coolers and fans, our homes, businesses, hospitals and all the other things that help keep us alive, and maybe not so much focus on the border wall.

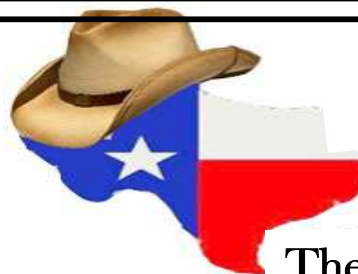
