The Weather

Lampasas City Council

The Lampasas City Council met yesterday for a regularly scheduled meeting. During the workshop session Fire Chief Jeff Smith shared that Public Health Region 7 would be updating the cases to the public each Friday. Since June 10th, Lampasas County has had only 10 new cases, and there were zero new cases last week.

During the regular meeting, the consent agenda passed, as well as approving a special use permit to allow 206 N. Chestnut to have a storage shed on their property.

In the City Manager's Report, Finley de Graffenried stated that the city is on the last edit of the comprehensive plan. He also advised that the Central Texas Water Supply Corporation filed for a rehearing with the 8th Court of Appeals, centered around changing the definition of 'cost' away from cost calculations.

Senator Dawn Buckingham will be at the Calvert Building on July 2^{nd} at 2:15pm to review the recent legislative session, and what pertains to the city of Lampasas. He spoke about a request to Anjinomoto foods about their processing and a proposal was received about the plant and forwarded to Jones-Heroy for review. The Capital Improvement Plan should be presented to Council on July 12^{th} .

Other comments by the City Manager indicate the construction projects around town are moving along, and Spring Ho looks to be in good shape. The City is also looking into bringing more utilities to eh Lampasas Business Park to encourage growth there.

In new business, the voluntary annex of the Hillside Acres Subdivision passed with a unanimous vote, no second reading necessary. There was no action on the livestock ordinance, it will wait for a later date.

The Lawsuit Against **Governor Abbott**

According to a story in the Texas Tribune, A group that includes Texas House Democrats and legislative staffers is asking the Texas Supreme Court to override Gov. Greg Abbott's recent veto of a portion of the state budget that funds the Legislature, staffers there and legislative agencies.

More than 60 Democratic members of the House signed a petition for a writ of mandamus, (A (writ of) mandamus is an order from a court to an inferior government official ordering the government official to properly fulfill their official duties or correct an abuse of discretion) which was filed Friday morning, as did the House Democratic Caucus and the Mexican American Legislative Caucus, four state employees and the Texas AFL-CIO.

The petition argues that Abbott exceeded his executive authority and violated the state's separation of powers doctrine. The parties involved with the petition are asking court to find Abbott's veto unconstitutional, which would allow Article X of the state budget, the section at issue, to become law later this year.

State Rep. Chris Turner, a Grand Prairie Democrat who chairs his party's caucus in the lower chamber, told reporters Thursday there are roughly 2,000 employees in the state's legislative branch that would be affected by Abbott's veto if it stands.

Lawmakers receive \$600 a month in addition to a per diem of \$221 every day the Legislature is in session for both regular and special sessions.
