The Weather

Today: Look for cloudy skies this morning, then clearing and a high temperature near 89°, and a 30% chance of showers and storms. Winds will become SE near 5 mph.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on June 25th.

Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 45 cases were brought to the court with 35 cases involving men, and 10 case involving women. Christopher Macgeorge, of Leander failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance/PG1/1-4 grams. Brandon Tengler failed to appear on a burglary charge.

There were 17 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 11 cases for less than a gram, and 6 cases for 1-4 grams. There was one case involving possession of a controlled substance/ PG2, for under a gram. There were 3 DWI cases for a single defendant.

There was 1 case each for; fraud, harassment of a public servant, and theft of a firearm. There were 6 cases for burglary, 5 for tampering w/evidence, and two each for criminal mischief and evading arrest w/ a vehicle. There were also 4 cases of engaging in organized criminal activity.



Cases involving personal harm included one case each for aggravated assault causing bodily injury, abandon/neglect of a child, and injury to a child/elderly/disabled person.

Of the 45 cases, 4 were settled. Randall Recker, on 3 separate charges of DWI 3rd or more, received 6 years TDCJ probated for each charge and must attend a SAFFP program. Demarcus Tilley of Kempner plead guilty to abandon/endanger a child/criminal negligence, and was sentenced to 2 years probation, a \$2000 fine and court costs.

All other cases were rescheduled or set for another date.

Missing Soldier in Contact with Officials

Fort Hood officials are in contact with Spc. Abram Salas II, who was the focus of a search that started after he disappeared almost a week ago and they are arranging for his return to post.

Salas "confirmed he is safe and residing with relatives in the San Antonio area," Fort Hood said in a press release late Tuesday morning.

"Our number one priority remains getting Spc. Salas back to Fort Hood. We will not stop until we know he is back safely," said Col. Chad R. Foster, commander of U.S. Army Garrison-Fort Hood.

Salas, 21, got married just days before he disappeared, and family members said they believed the marriage and the disappearance were connected.

He got married and everybody found out about it on social media, and no one knew about this person before," said Teresa Kiphen, the soldier's aunt.

Salas' parents left Fort Hood Tuesday morning to return to their home in El Paso.

"We met with our son's leadership and Fort Hood law enforcement officials yesterday on base. After listening to everyone and getting our questions answered, we are confident that Fort Hood is doing everything they can to bring our son home," said Abram Salas Sr., Salas' father.

"We just want AJ to know we love him," said Lorena Salas, Salas' mother.

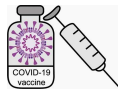

1st Lady in Texas to Promote Covid Vaccinations



(Texas Tribune) In a bid to boost the country's COVID-19 vaccination rate, First Lady Jill Biden traveled to Texas on Tuesday and toured a Dallas vaccination site with retired Dallas Cowboys star Emmitt Smith.

"We're not done yet," she said at Emmett J. Conrad High School. "Right now, only 40% of Texans are fully vaccinated and like Emmitt said, it's not enough.

"And your lives matter to me and your president."

Her Texas swing was part of a larger effort by senior administration officials who are fanning out across the country this week to encourage vaccinations ahead of the administration's self-imposed goal of hitting a 70% countrywide vaccination rate by July 4. Last week, a Biden administration official said the country was unlikely to meet that goal.

About 41% of Texans are fully vaccinated, while the number of hospitalizations and the weekly average of new cases are on the decline in the state. Health officials say 75% to 90% of Texans would need to be vaccinated to achieve herd immunity. Nationwide, about 66% of adults have at least one dose of the vaccine, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Biden later traveled to Houston for Tuesday evening, where she was joined by Second Gentleman Douglas Emhoff. The two visited a Houston Astros-sponsored vaccination site and then attended an Astros game at Minute Maid Park, sitting with military members and frontline workers. While there, the first lady pointed to Texas' low vaccine rate as part of the impetus for coming to the state.

"Because the numbers are low here," she said when asked why she came to Texas. "I think 40% of all Texans are vaccinated, so that's, you know, the president and the vice president, Doug and I care about the American people about their health. So that's why I'm here."

Earlier in the day, Department of Homeland Security Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas traveled to San Antonio to tour a vaccination site there. President Joe Biden will travel to Michigan over the weekend.
