The heat index yesterday reached 103° in Lampasas.

The forecasters say that the rain chances are slim to none in the next few days. While it is not forecast to be as humid, the heat index is expected to affect temperatures. Heat advisories in some areas are likely, as well as some excessive heat warnings. The good news, sort of, is that the heat wave should peak next Sunday with temperatures reflecting normal heat.


Today: Look for partly sunny skies and a high near 96°, with a heat index near 102°. Winds will be S-SE near 5-10 mph. There is a slight chance of precipitation.

Tonight: Skies will be mostly cloudy with a low temperature near 74°. Winds will be E at 5-10 mph. There is a 30% chance of showers after midnight.

Tuesday: Mostly cloudy skies and a high near 93°. Heat index values could reach 98°. Winds will be S at 5 mph. There is a 30% chance of showers and storms very early in the morning. **Tuesday Night**: Look for partly cloudy skies overnight, with a low temperature near 75°. Winds will be S-SE at 5 mph. **Wednesday**: Mostly Sunny with a high near 97°. Wind will be S at 5-10 mph.

Covid-19 Update

Dr. Georgia Hay, the Lampasas County Health Authority sent an update this morning to Lampasas Radio. Lampasas County now has 40 total cases with 21 active and 1 in the hospital.



Texas has had 195,239 residents test positive for COVID-19 as of July 5^{th} . That is 3,449 more than the day before and 46,516 more than a week ago.

The state website shows our Trauma Service Area, made up of Milam, Mills, Bell, Coryell, and Lampasas Counties, as of yesterday at 3:15pm has 17 ICU beds available. There were 30 available on Friday.

Referring to the COVID-19 face covering exemption, Judge Hoyer sent the following:

"I am sending out this email to inform you that I will not be submitting the GA-29 Attestation Exemption Form allowing Lampasas County to opt-out of the face-covering requirement issued by the Governor. To meet the minimal cases of COVID-19 to file the face-covering exemption, a County cannot have more than 20 active cases. If a County that files the attestation to opt-out goes over 20 active cases, the face-covering order must be followed. As of today, Lampasas County has 40 total cases, 20 active, and one hospitalized. With our current active number at 20, I believe we will be over 20 by the end of today."

BACK TO SCHOOL

From Dr.Chane Rascoe

We plan to start school on August 10, 2020 with kids. This will include transportation, food service, etc. Additional guidelines from TEA will be provided soon. Important information we know now to communicate:

Recommended Supplies for Returning to School:

A thermometer (to keep at home to check temperature) Several face coverings/masks, Hand Sanitizer (small bottles), Water bottle (students can fill their own bottle),

When school resumes, please check your child's temperature *every morning*. If your child has fever, please do NOT send them to school!

COVID-19 related symptoms include but are not limited to: Fever ≥100.4° F. Cough (not due to pre-existing or non-infectious conditions like allergies), Shortness of breath, Loss of smell, Sore throat, Weakness, Muscle pain, Pink Eye, Chills. Please work with your child to learn how to properly wash their hands/use hand sanitizer. Frequent handwashing will be encouraged throughout the school year. Getting the flu shot is also recommended.

Questions:

Will parents be able to decide whether their child attends school in person or by way of remote instruction for the 2020-2021 school year?

Parents will have the option to select how their student receives instruction. However, please be aware that remote instruction will match the level of rigor used during in-person instruction. If remote learning is chosen, parents may be required to remain in remote learning the entire grading period. Those who select remote instruction are encouraged to submit the questionnaire that has been distributed.

What will remote learning look like this fall for students 3rd-12th grade?

Remote learning will look different than it did in the Spring of 2020 - spring instruction was not designed to sustain learning at a level needed to be effective for an entire school year. Parents and students should be prepared to attend remote instruction every day, at set times, and follow a daily schedule. They should anticipate assignments that must be completed daily to meet attendance requirements. Student attendance will be recorded, and the State's rules regarding required attendance will apply. Remote instruction will be delivered in a manner that is sensitive to students of different ages/ability levels.

What will remote learning look like this fall for students PreK-2nd grade?

Remote learning will look different than it did in the Spring of 2020 - spring instruction was not designed to sustain learning at a level needed to be effective for an entire school year. Students will learn from instruction that is not necessarily being delivered in-person or in real time and may include various forms of digital and online learning (for example, prerecorded video lessons, game-based learning tasks, pre-assigned work, and formative assessments). The biggest difference parents will notice is that the State will require attendance to be recorded daily. Parents should anticipate assignments that must be completed daily to meet attendance recording requirements.

What will my student need if we choose for them to participate in remote learning?

A learning device, access to the internet, and the student's ability to structure their time and work without direct supervision. Lampasas ISD will continue to issue learning devices grades 5-12.

Will parents be able to change their decision for a student to receive online or face-to-face instruction after the year begins? Yes, at the end of a grading period, campus and district staff will work with families to change learning models should parents request it.

Will the District have a traditional Meet the Teacher Night?

The district will not be conducting the traditional Meet the Teacher Night this year at the start of school. LISD is planning to have something for our PreK/Kindergarten students that will be scaled down with less numbers of people congregating.

How will my child receive their schedule and know their teacher before school starts?

Since the district will not have a traditional meet the teacher night, parents will need to sign up for Family Access in order to view their child's schedule and teacher. Family Access will open July 22, 2020 for parents to update their information and receive a copy of their student's schedule. There will be a link on our website once it's open.
