## The Weather

#### The High yesterday $87^{\circ}$ The Low this morning $76^{\circ}$

The forecasters say to look for temperatures in the mid 90's and a heat index possible in areas of 105°. Rain chances are zero through next week, and the big story will be the heat, which is slated to be oppressive in Central Texas. The upper level ridge will strengthen over the weekend and into next week. This will result in many locations seeing the hottest temperatures of the year. The actual temperature readings are expected to be in the 100°-105° range. This combined with the humidity will have heat indices in the 105°-110° range. The western part of the region may see reading closer to 101°-103°. Look for heat advisories and excessive heat warnings to be issued.

**Today:** Partly sunny skies with gradual clearing and a high temperature near 95°. Winds will be S at 5-10 mph.

**Tonight:** The skies will be mostly clear with a low near 75°. There will be S breezes at 5-10 mph.

**Thursday**: Mostly sunny with a high near 95°. The wind will be S at 10-15 mph.

**Thursday Night:** Mostly clear and a low around 75°. Winds will be S at 5-10 mph.


**Friday:** Sunny and up to 97° with a S wind at 5-10 mph.

**Friday Night:** Mostly clear skies and a low temperature near 75°.

**Saturday:** Sunny with high temperatures near  $100^{\circ}$  and a heat index near  $105^{\circ}$ .

## **Coronavirus Update**

**Dr. Georgia Hay** contacted Lampasas Radio this morning. Lampasas County now has 48 cases, 25 active and 1 hospitalized.



Texas reported 10,028 new cases yesterday.

There are 9,286 Texans in the hospital for the coronavirus as of July 7. That is 2,753 more than a week ago. They occupy 17% of hospital beds. The Trauma Service Area for Lampasas shows 69 patients in the hospital and 18 ICU beds available for the 5-county area.

## **TEA Guidelines Released**

The Texas Education Agency yesterday released guidelines for the upcoming school year.

The biggest takeaways seem to be that for remote learning, parents have to plan on completing assignments every day to satisfy attendance requirements.

In the spring, when remote learning became a necessity *Emergency Guidelines* were put in place, but they were not meant to accommodate an entire school-year worth of learning.

Now the guidelines are for a sustained year of learning.

If the face mask mandate is still in place, students over the age of 10 will be required to wear them.





Deputies went into Cove on a report of suspicious activity, a medical call, a fish & game call and a civil matter.

#### The signs of a heat-related illness.

During extremely hot and humid weather, your body's ability to cool itself is challenged. When the body heats too rapidly to cool itself properly, or when too much fluid or salt is lost through dehydration or sweating, body temperature rises. **Heat cramps** may be the first sign of heat-related illness, and may lead to heat exhaustion or stroke.

Symptoms: Painful muscle cramps and spasms usually in legs and abdomen, heavy sweating.

What to do: Apply firm pressure on cramping muscles or gently massage to relieve spasm, give sips of water unless the person complains of nausea, then stop giving water.



**Heat Exhaustion** symptoms are; Heavy sweating, weakness, cool,/pale/clammy skin, fast/weak pulse, possible muscle cramps, dizziness, nausea or vomiting, fainting.

What to do: Move person to a cooler environment,

lay person down and loosen clothing, apply cool/wet cloths to as much of the body as possible, fan or move victim to air conditioned room, offer sips of water.

**Heat stroke** symptoms are; Altered mental state, one or more of the following symptoms: throbbing headache,

confusion, nausea, dizziness, shallow breathing. Body temperature above 103°F, hot, red, dry or moist skin, Rapid and strong pulse, faints, loses consciousness.

What to do: Heat stroke is a severe medical emergency. Call 911 or get the victim to a hospital immediately. Delay can be fatal. Move the victim to a cooler, preferably air-conditioned, environment. Reduce body temperature with cool cloths or bath.

Use fan *if heat index temperatures are below the high 90s*. A fan can make you hotter at higher temperatures.

Do NOT give fluids.

\*To avoid any kind of heat illness, make sure you drink plenty of fluids, stay in an air-conditioned room, stay out

of the sun, and check up on relatives and neighbors.

\*Young children and pets should never be left unattended in vehicles under any circumstances.

\*Know the signs and symptoms of heat exhaustion and heat stroke.
