The heat index yesterday reached 102° in Lampasas.

Heat is the main story again as temperatures climb in to the mid and upper 90's. The heat indices are expected to be in the 104° - 107° range. On Friday, the highs are expected to be near 100° and heat indices in the 105° - 110° range. The oppressive heat is expected to last through at least early next week. The current heat advisory does not include Lampasas, Mills or Comanche counties; however the current heat advisory will probably be extended through Sunday.

Today: Mostly sunny with a high near 95°. The winds will be S at 10-15 mph.

Tonight: Mostly clear with a low near 75°. Winds will be S at 5-10 mph.

Friday: Sunny skies with a high temperature near 98°. Winds will be S at 5-10 mph.

Friday Night: Mostly clear with a low near 75°. Winds will be S near 5-10 mph.

Saturday: Sunny skies and a high temperature near 101° with a heat index near 105°. Winds will be S at 5-10 mph.

Saturday Night: 78° with mostly clear skies

Lampasas COVID-19

Lampasas Radio was contacted this morning by Dr. Georgia Hay with an update on cases. As of this morning, Lampasas County has 55 total cases, 26 active and 1 hospitalized. On July 8th, 9,979 new cases were reported. According to an article in the Texas Tribune there were 37,421 viral tests reported on July 7. That made the positivity rate — the percentage of positive cases to viral tests conducted over seven days — 15%. The tribune also reported 9,610 Texans are in the hospital for the corona virus as of July 8 — 2,706 more than a week ago. They occupy 17% of hospital beds.

According to the state website, our Trauma Service Area (L), made up of Milam, Mills, Hamilton, Coryell, Bell and Lampasas Counties, had 13 ICU hospital beds available, and 76 corona virus patients hospitalized in our trauma area.

Area Economy on Hold

A survey of local businesses (mostly restaurants), shows that most are open for business. Bill's Burgers, Eve's, The Country Kitchen, and most others have indoor dining available at 50% capacity, including the Brick Oven in Kempner. McDonalds, Taco Bell and Pizza Hut are not offering indoor dining, though you can eat on the patio at Taco Bell.

It appears that the economy, while partially reopened, is in a holding pattern. Businesses are waiting to see what the COVID-19 uptick will bring. More closures, or more allowed re-openings. No one wants to offer any kind of projections, so we wait and see.

Local Area Sales Tax Report

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced Wednesday \$744.2 million in local sales tax allocations for June 2020, only 2.6% less than in June 2019. These allocations are based on May sales from businesses that report tax monthly.



In nearby Hamilton County, Evant received a check for \$3640.24, 18.71% over the same time period last year. The city of Hamilton, saw a 20.7% increase to\$52,767.77 this year. In San Saba County, San Saba received a rebate for \$46,822.85, up 30.58 % from last year.

In Lampasas County, the City of Lometa saw an increase during this time frame of 21.06% which garnered them a rebate check for \$7,507.51. Kempner saw an increase of 29.02% for a rebate of \$11,128.27, and the City of Lampasas saw an increase of 26.57% for a rebate of \$193,607.43.

Wildfire Season

Signs are pointing to a severe wildfire season in Texas.

The Texas A&M Forest Service says most of the state is trending ahead of typical early summer drying. Hot and dry weather conditions reduce the moisture content in grass and wood vegetation. This increases the potential for wildfire ignition. It has already ignited in some places. The Forest Service and local fire departments have responded to nearly 100 wildfires. Crews recently battled fires in Sterling County, Concho County, Potter County, Schleicher County and Reagan County. The Sterling County fire was the largest, burning over 5,400 acres before being totally contained.

About 90 percent of wildfires are caused by humans and their activities. Many of the recent wildfires are attributed to equipment use, welding, debris burning and roadside starts.

Now is the time to prepare your house and property to make them wildfire resilient.

Officials recommend creating an evacuation plan for your family that includes pets and livestock. Look for the buildup of dead and dry vegetative material around your house, the driveway and other important buildings, as this is where embers can gather and start fires. (cont'd on back)






