The heat index reached 100° yesterday in Lampasas.

Tropical Storm Hanna is headed toward the Lower Texas Coast. The rain chances are diminishing for our area, but may fire up on a Killeen to Waco line this evening. For tomorrow, the chance of precipitation decreases the farther north you go. The winds from Hanna should keep temperatures a few degrees cooler with highs in the lower 90's. The rain chances on Sunday should be lower than Saturday, but the forecasters say affecting Central Texas Counties.

Today: Mostly sunny skies with a high temperature near 96° and a heat index near 100° . Winds will be E-NE at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy with a low near 75°. Winds will be E at 5-15 mph, with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Saturday: A 40% chance of showers. Skies will be mostly cloudy with a high temperature near 92°, and a heat index as high as 100°. Winds will be

Saturday Night: The 40% chance of showers continues into early Sunday morning. Mostly cloudy with a low near 73°. Winds will be E-SE at 10-15 mph, gusting to 25 mph.

Sunday: Partly sunny with a high temperature near 91°. Wind will be E-SE at 5-10 mph. A 40% chance of precipitation continues.

Sunday night: A continued 40% chance of showers and storms with a low near 73° and SE wind near 5-15 mph. Look for skies to be partly cloudy.

Tropical Storm Hanna

Tropical Storm Hanna is expected to reach the Texas coast sometime tomorrow morning. While our rain chances are going down, some Texans will feel the wrath of this storm. 

Georgia Hay shared with Lampasas Radio that Lampasas now has a total of 139 cases with 52 active, and 3 in the hospital. The state website states that Lampasas County has 65 positive cases, while our Trauma Service Area had 10 available ICU beds and 142 patients in the hospital with COVID-19. Texas reported 9,507 new cases yesterday, and 8,858 Texans are hospitalized with COVID-19.

Mask Mandate may keep Texas Businesses Open

(Texas Tribune) Three weeks after Gov. Greg Abbott required Texans to wear masks, epidemiologists and disease modelers say they are cautiously optimistic that the mandate is helping the state turn a corner in its efforts to contain an outbreak that has killed more than 4.500 Texans.

Throughout the summer, Texas' coronavirus outbreak became grimmer by the day and by almost every metric: case counts, hospitalizations, deaths. But in the past week or so, Abbott and some of the state's public health officials began to see hope in the daily case counts as they appeared to stabilize.

The governor, who has faced blistering criticism for his handling of the pandemic from members of his own political party, immediately seized upon those findings in defense of his statewide order. "A community lock down is not needed as long as masks & other distancing strategies are used," Abbott wrote Monday on Twitter, citing the analysis by Rajesh Nandy, a professor of biostatistics and epidemiology at the University of North Texas Health Science Center.

But public health experts warn that more restrictive lockdowns may still be appropriate in the state's hardest-hit regions, as the disease continues to infect about 10 times as many people each day compared with two months ago, ravaging some parts of the state more severely than others.

While there is widespread consensus that more people wearing face coverings in public will slow viral spread, researchers disagree over how much credit to assign to the statewide mask order.

After waffling on mask mandates, first prohibiting Texas cities from enforcing them and later issuing a statewide order, Abbott hopes to avoid the possibility of a business shutdown, which is even more unpopular among members of his party.

But public health experts say shutdowns are an effective measure that may be appropriate in areas with severe outbreaks.

Even Nandy's analysis, presented to government officials, academics and journalists this week, argued that a shelter-in-place order "should not be ruled out in the event of another surge," a point echoed by epidemiologists across Texas.

This week the state's largest cities began to report signs that viral transmission had slowed. Conservative politicians, including state Sen. Paul Bettencourt, R-Houston, heralded the findings as reason to "keep the Texas economy open and fight the virus at the same time."
