

The High yesterday 57 $^{\circ}$ The Low morning 32 $^{\circ}$



Tonight: Look for mostly clear skies and a low near 29° and winds will be calm.

Saturday: Mostly sunny then becoming mostly cloudy in the afternoon with an advancing weather system. Winds will be light from the east and the high will be near 52° .

Saturday Night: Mostly cloudy with a low near 35°. Winds will be E at 5-10 mph gusting to 20mph. There are precipitation chances across SW Central Texas after midnight, with snow possible. The NWS tells us that areas along and west of 281 may see 2-4" of snow.

Sunday: Cloudy skies with a 90% chance of precipitation, and the possibility of rain changing to snow and a high near 41°. Winds will be NE at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Overnight Sunday: Mostly cloudy and cold with a 30% chance of rain or snow and a low near 29°. Winds will be N-NW near 10 mph with possible gusts of 20mph.


The State of Texas saw 19,598 new confirmed cases yesterday, and 4,320 new prob-

Vaccinations...

The DSHS website shows that as of yesterday at 3:40pm, Lampasas County has had 175 people vaccinated with one dose, an increase of 9 vaccinations since Wednesday and no one has been vaccinated with the second dose.

Also, according to the DSHS website, as of 3:40 pm yesterday, Texas has been sent 1,362,850 total doses of the vaccine. This number represents a decrease of 12,150 doses shown in the DSHS website. Of the vaccines received, 527,533 doses have been administered, up from 475,627 yesterday. A total of 39.7% of doses recorded in Texas have been administered.


