## The Weather

### The Weather

**Today:** Skies will be cloudy with a high temperature near 51°, and a S wind at 5 mph. There is a 40% chance of precipitation.

**Tonight:** Mostly cloudy skies and the low temperature will dip to near 34°. Winds will become calm.

**Wednesday:** Mostly cloudy skies with gradual clearing and a high temperature near 64°. Winds will become W-SW at 5 mph.

**Overnight Wednesday:** Clear skies and the low temperature will be near 35° with light N-NW wind.

**Thursday:** Sunny skies and a high near 71°. Winds will be NW near 5 mph.

**Thursday Night:** Clear skies with a low near 39° and light SW winds.

## District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Docket Call on January 7<sup>th</sup>. Presiding over the Court was 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 36 cases were brought to the court with 25 cases involving men, and 11 cases involving women.

There were 15 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 11 cases for less than a gram, 3 cases for 1-4 grams, and 1 case for 4-200 grams. There were 3 cases for possession of a controlled substance PG 2 less than a gram. There were 2 cases for evading arrest, 3 for theft, two cases each for forgery and prohibited substance in a correctional facility, one case for bail jumping/failure to appear and one case for theft of a firearm.

There was 1 cases each for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, one case for intoxication manslaughter, one case for stalking and one for aggravated sexual assault of a child. There were 2 cases of indecency with a child/sexual contact.



Of the cases heard, 1 was settled with Yaritzel Chandler of Copperas Cove pleading guilty to a reduced charge, a class A misdemeanor court costs and a fine for evading arrest w/ a vehicle.

The rest of the cases were reset or had dates set for jury trials.

## Outdoor Burning Guidelines

The Lampasas County Commissioner's Court on Monday adopted an order restricting outdoor burning due to drought conditions.

Outdoor burning is banned with these exceptions; BBQ's in an area free of debris, household trash in a receptacle that is enclosed and covered with a mesh material with no more than ¼ inch openings. Also allowed are controlled burns necessary for the maintenance of existing and actively farmed hay fields under specific conditions, this order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities authorized by the TCEQ for specific purposes, fireworks shows are allowed with an experienced pyrotechnician and fire suppression equipment, and to use an Air Curtain Incinerator the operator must obtain Air Curtain Incinerator General Operating Permit from TCEQ. Violations of this order are class C misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of up to \$500.

## Coronavirus Update

Statewide, according to the DSHS there were 41,968 new and 5,269 probable new cases on January 10th, along with 6 deaths. There were also 10,417 Texans in the hospital with Covid-19. Locally, the DSHS dashboard shows 23 cases confirmed yesterday, and 238 cases for the last week. The state estimates Lampasas County to have 269 active cases at this time.

## Winter Storm Readiness

Last February's winter storm marked a severe weather event unlike any Texans had seen in decades, leaving millions without power and in freezing conditions. Days into the storm and its aftermath, a full-blown water crisis also emerged as well as supply chain shortages and major food disruptions. (cont'd on back)

## The Blotter



**Lampasas Police Dept.** blotter for Monday shows a reported theft in the 300 block of E. 4<sup>th</sup> St. at 8:47am, and then another theft was reported in the 100 block of E. 9<sup>th</sup> St. at 11:37am. The afternoon shows a domestic disturbance reported in the 300 block of Walnut St. at 1:42pm. a reported fraud in the 200 block of Riverview Dr. at 2:43pm and a disturbance in the 400 block of S. Pecan St. at 4:30pm. There was a minor accident in the 800 block of N. Key at 4:56pm and suspicious activity was reported in the 500 block of N. Ridge at 5:07pm.

**The Sheriff's Dept. Blotter** for Monday shows Lometa with a fire and a medical call. In Kempner there were medical calls, reports of suspicious activity, animal issues, reported disturbances and a juvenile problem. Out in the county there were animal issues, reported disturbances, medical issues, civil matters, an accident, an alarm call and a reported trespassing. Deputies went into Cove on an accident.

A recent report from the Texas Department of State Health Services updated the death toll from the winter storm and brought it up to 246, though a BuzzFeed analysis last year found the deaths related to the storm could've been more than 750. The state attributed the majority of deaths to hypothermia, but other causes included carbon monoxide poisoning, fires and falls.

The storm's "severity and its reach across the whole state of Texas and the length of it did catch lots of us all by surprise, myself included," said Monty C. Dozier, director of the disaster assessment and recovery program at Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service.

Weather experts say a similar winter storm is unlikely but still possible this year. The state has already experienced its first strong winter cold snap, and with the thick of the winter season still approaching, there's plenty Texans can do to prepare in case an extreme weather system sweeps through the state again.

Have a winter kit on hand

Many Texans are used to gearing up for hurricane season. The same mindset should apply during the winter months, Dozier said.

"The thing about winter storms (is) they're a lot like a hurricane," he said. "We have a little bit of an extended period (where meteorologists) are forecasting that we're going to have freezing temperatures and snow accumulations, so it gives a little time to prepare."

Nick Hampshire, a meteorologist with the National Weather Service, suggests having a "winter survival kit" on hand complete with a one- to two-week supply of nonperishable food and water for your family and pets. A good rule of thumb is to have a gallon of water per person, per day.

"As we went through Winter Storm Uri in February, that would have meant we needed about six to eight days worth of water in some parts of the state," Dozier said.

Dozier recommends stocking up on bottled water for human consumption. If people are unable to access bottled water, Texans should consider purchasing large containers to hold multiple gallons of drinking water, said Selena Xie, president of the Austin-Travis County EMS Association, in an interview with The Texas Tribune.

Winter kits should also include blankets, extra warm clothes, a first-aid kit, portable lights and extra batteries. Dozier said a battery-powered radio to listen to weather forecasts and news is another good purchase. And you might want to keep some emergency supplies stored in your car like sleeping bags, drinking water, a shovel for digging out of snow, booster cables and something to create traction on your tires such as sand or kitty litter.
