

The Weather



High yesterday was 68 ° Low this morning was 45°

Looks like another soggy day in store with the highest concentration of rainfall west of I35. Minor flooding is possible in area that received significant rainfall yesterday. A cold front will arrive in north Texas tonight providing one last chance for rainfall before moving from northwest to southeast tomorrow morning. The air behind this front will be much drier allowing skies to clear, but the northerly winds at 15-25 will make a blustery Saturday.

Today: Patchy fog before 1pm and a high near 60°. Wind will be NE near 5 mph shifting S in the afternoon. 80% chance of showers and storms in the afternoon.

Tonight: An 80% chance of showers and storms until early Saturday morning. Cloudy with a low near 51°. Winds will be S at 5-10 mph shifting to the W after midnight.

Saturday: A small chance of showers early in the morning then a mostly sunny day and a high near 62°. W wind at 5-15 mph, shifting to the N in the afternoon. Gusts could reach as high as 20 mph.

Saturday night: N-NE wind at 10 mph and mostly clear skies and a low near 34°.

Sunday: Sunny with a high temperature near 53°. Winds will be NE at 10 mph.

Overnight: Mostly cloudy and a low near 35°. Winds will continue from the NE at 5-10 mph

USMCA Approved

Texas Farm Bureau President Russell Boening issued the following statement after the US Senate approved JR 5430, The United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement Implementation Act:

“Today is a positive day for Texas farmers and ranchers. The approval of the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) by the U.S. Senate and, now, Congress, represents an important step in the economic recovery of American agriculture.

“USMCA protects our important trade relationships with our nearest neighbors and returns certainty to our markets. Texas farmers and ranchers look forward to providing products to these valued customers for years to come.

“Trade is vital to the livelihood of American farmers, consumers and the U.S. food industry. We thank U.S. Senators John Cornyn and Ted Cruz for their strong support of this agreement. We appreciate the support of the entire Texas congressional delegation in their approval of USMCA, because this agreement presents an opportunity for growth, increased prosperity and much-needed certainty for Texans.”

Notice From Kempner WSC

Lampasas Radio received the following notice from Ricky Roy, Public Works Director for the City of Lampasas.



“The Kempner Water Supply Corporation, PWS #1410028, along with the City of Lampasas, PWS#1410001, and Salado Water Supply, PWS #1410035 will temporarily convert the disinfectant used in the distribution system from chloramine to free chlorine. The conversion will begin on February 15, 2020 and continue through March 15, 2020. During this period, you may experience taste and odor changes associated with this type of temporary disinfectant conversion.

Public water systems are required to properly disinfect their water and maintain an adequate disinfectant residual in the distribution system. Chloramine, free chlorine combined with ammonia, is widely used as a disinfectant because it persists for long periods while also limiting the formation of disinfection by-product contaminants. Prolonged use of chloramine coupled with other factors that can impact water quality, such as high temperatures or
