The Weather

The High yesterday 67° The Low this morning 54° Today: Look for sunny skies for the first time in several days, and a high temperature near 71°. Winds will be W, increasing in the afternoon to 15-25mph and possibly gusting to 35mph. Tonight: Mostly clear with the low temperature near 40°, and winds will become light from the W-SW in the evening. A cold

Monday Meetings

The Lampasas County Commissioners' Court met today at 9am in the Commissioners' Courtroom at the Lampasas Courthouse.

The Agenda included the consent agenda, accounts payable/ payroll; a discussion of the county-wide Burn Ban; the approval of bonds for elected officials, discussion of leave for Covid-19 related absence for work; a resolution concerning the private railroad crossing at Lee Gap; lawn maintenance; a request bid for asphalt & emulsion; the Sheriff's Department request for approval of a lease agreement with Enterprise for fleet units; Child Welfare Board business, a racial profiling reports for 2020 from Constable Dennis James; and, of course the Jail Project 2017

The Lampasas City Council will meet this evening for a workshop, executive, special and regular session beginning at 5:30pm. The agenda for the workshop session includes;



a presentation by Jason Jones of Jones-Heroy Consulting engineers regarding the pre-treatment study for the city's wastewater plant and recommendations. Discussion and updates on the City of Lampasas Public Safety Communications System Equipment, and discussion regarding possible amendments to the City of Lampasas Employee Personnel Policy.

Council will then go into executive session for an economic development issue, then return to a special session for discussion and possible action discussed in executive session. Council will then begin the regular meeting which includes the consent agenda, the second reading of an ordinance regarding a request to rezone property at 907 E. 3rd St. form light industrial to two family residential, board & departmental reports, routine matters to include the city manager's operational report, and

mayor's comments. New business includes discussion and consideration of the following; a contract services agreement between the City and County of Lampasas., use of Joint Use Facilities Fund for a Central Texas Water Corporation Plant upgrade, nominating a candidate for the Board of Directors of the Central Texas Water Supply Corporation, and expenditure for bathrooms for the street & electric department building in the amount of \$35,750, acceptance of the 2019-2020 year-end financial report, and an ordinance concerning the May 1st general election.

The State of Texas saw 9,731 new confirmed cases yesterday, and 1,358 new probable cases. 12,899 Texans are hospitalized with Covid-19.



Vaccinations...

The DSHS website shows that as of yesterday at 12:08pm, Lampasas County has had 508 people vaccinated with one dose, and 61 residents have been vaccinated with the second dose. Also, according to the DSHS website, as of 5:28pm yesterday, Texas has been sent 2,807,050 total doses of the vaccine. Of the vaccines received, 1,713,980 doses have been administered. That is a total of 61% of the available vaccine. 1,459,293Texas residents have received one dose, and 254,687 have been fully vaccinated. In our area, Coryell County Health is expected to receive 975 doses this week, and Bell County Public Health is scheduled to receive 3900 doses.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on January 22nd. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 29 cases were brought to the court



with 20 cases involving men, and 9 cases involving women, with and 5 cases were for a single defendant. Andrew Perez, of Copperas Cove failed to appear on a charge of possession of a controlled substance/PG1/less than a gram and a warrant was issued. John Lockhart, on 2 charges of indecency w/child/sexual contact had his bond conditions amended. Kelly Bender had bond set at \$3000, with no PR bond, and Billy Tate Shoaf had 2 bench warrants issued. (*cont'd on back*)

The Burn Ban goes back into effect today at 5pm!

There were 6 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/ PG1; there were 4 cases for possession less than a gram, with one in a drug free zone, and two cases for possession 1-4grams. There were 4 cases for possession of a controlled substance/PG2; one for less than a gram, 2 cases for 1-4 grams, and 1 case for 4-400 grams. There was one case for DWI. There were 2 cases for evading arrest w/a vehicle, 3 for burglary of a habitation, 3 for credit/debit card abuse, and one each for theft of property \$2500-\$30,000 and unauthorized use of a motor vehicle. There was one case for abandoning/endangering a child.

Crimes involving personal harm included one case for injury to a child/elderly/disabled, 3 aggravated assault cases, and 3 cases for indecency w/child/sexual contact.
