Meetings on Monday include Lampasas

County Commissioners, in session at 9am in the courthouse downstairs courtroom. On the agenda are some routine matters, then a request for a bid on asphalt and emulsion and the appointment of new commissioner Jamie Smart to serve on the Hill Country Community Action board. There is also the almost permanent short discussion of the progress on the jail project.

Lampasas City Council meets at 5:30pm for a closed session where they'll have deliberations on real estate, then back in a workshop they'll discuss the status of capital improvement projects that are funded by that big 2016 bond issue. One of those is the possible construction of a water/wastewater lab and office building that has been a subject of some disagreement in the past.

In regular session new business the Council will present the ordinance calling for election of Mayor and Council members for places 1, 2 and 6 on May 4th. Another issue in that same election will be a local option alcoholic beverage matter. They will also look at an expense of some \$12,800 to rid City Hall of a bat population. Another proposal is for stair improvements and a desk for the City Manager/City Secretary with the total expense to be \$3,800, and some possible fee changes for County residents to use the City disposal of recyclable materials.

And, the final big ticket item will be the possible award of a contract to build a new Water/Wastewater office and lab.
