The Weather



Lampasas Middle School Student Arrested



"This message is to inform you about the arrest today of a Lampasas Middle School student by our Lampasas Police Department after a report that the student allegedly made remarks threatening violence at school. The middle school administration, along with the School Resource Officer, immediately conducted an investigation. The responsible student will be charged by law enforcement, meanwhile we will follow district policies and procedures and take appropriate action in handling this issue. We want to assure you that we take all security related incidents very seriously, and we will always exercise caution regarding matters of safety.

Providing our students with a safe environment is our highest priority in Lampasas ISD. Every report made is investigated immediately, the appropriate action is taken, and the outcomes are communicated in a transparent manner.

We ask that parents have an important discussion with students about using good judgment. We have seen examples of students using good judgment in reporting these incidents to trusted adults. Administrators and teachers at all campuses have been meeting with students to explain the consequences that can occur if they make a threat against the school. However, it is important that this message be reinforced at home. Students need to know that it

is never acceptable to even joke about threatening a school and that these matters are serious and will be pursued as such. At the same time, please let your child(ren) know that if they see or hear of any type of threatening language suggesting violence against the school or other students to report it immediately. We must work together to make sure our students are in a safe environment in our schools. This is, and always will be, our first priority."

Monday Meeting Notes

Lampasas County Commissioners met Monday morning at a regularly scheduled meeting. The agenda included a discussion regarding the septic tank variances on Clear Creek subdivision. This subdivision is in precinct one,



which is Commissioner Bobby Carol's precinct. This area is also located in the Copperas Cove ETJ. Judge Hoyer stated "we have subdivision rules and regulations that were adopted by the commissioners court. In those rules and regulations it does state that those lots served by public water supply systems using individual on-site sewage systems must have a minimum lot size of 1 acre and a minimum of 60 feet of street frontage. The commissioners are being asked for a variance from the existing rules. In the subdivision rules and regulations there is a condition called "relief on subdivision rules and regulations". This statute states that commissioners court may authorize relief for the regulations in an open session. Today a variance was approved for the clear Creek subdivision.



The Lampasas City Council held their regular meeting Monday night in City Council Chambers. The agenda included; A change in the meeting time of City Council meetings. City Council meetings will now be at 6pm on the 2nd and 4th Mondays.

There will be a meeting over the Comprehensive Plan on February 13th. The primary focus of this meeting will be future land use and transportation.
