The forecasters are telling us that a cold front will usher in much colder air on Tuesday along with a chance of rain.

Today: Sunny with a high temperature near 69° with W-NW winds 10-15mph.

Tonight: Partly cloudy with lows in the lower 40s with W-SW winds 5-10mph.

Sunday: Mostly sunny with a high temperature near 77°. Winds will be SW at 10-15 mph .

Overnight: Mostly cloudy and a low near 54°. Winds will be from the S at 10-20 mph.

Monday: Cloudy skies early, and will become partly cloudy later in the day with a high near 74° with S-SW winds 10-20mph with a 10% chance of rain.

Monday Night: Mostly sunny with a low near 59° with S winds 10-15mph and a 20% chance of rain.

Tuesday: Mostly sunny with a high temperature near 80° with W winds 5-10mph and a 10% chance of rain.

Plan While You Can: Superbowl



“Plan While You Can” for a sober ride before enjoying game day watch parties and other activities that may include alcohol. While you are making big plans for the upcoming Super Bowl weekend, the Texas Department of Transportation is reminding football fans to use common sense and be safe!

“Super Bowl weekend is an especially dangerous time for drunk driving crashes,” said TxDOT Executive Director James Bass. “With so many choices available, there is absolutely no excuse to drink and drive. If you plan to drink alcohol, plan ahead for a sober ride. It’s a game plan that could save a life.”

During last year’s Super Bowl weekend, there were 310 DUI-alcohol related crashes in Texas. Those crashes killed 11 people and seriously injured another 27.

Driving under the influence of alcohol not only risks death or serious injuries, but it can also be costly. Drivers can face up to \$17,000 in fines and fees, jail time and loss of their driver’s license. Instead of getting behind the wheel, here are some alternative options:

- Designate a sober driver.
- Contact a cab or ride-share service.
- Use mass transit.
- Spend the night.

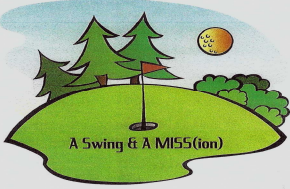

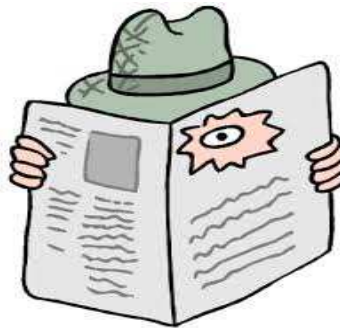

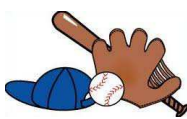
