The State of Texas saw 11,885 new confirmed cases yesterday, and 2,248 probable cases. 11,074 Texans are hospitalized with Covid-19

#### Vaccinations...

The DSHS website shows that as of yesterday at 3:36pm, Lampasas County has had 745 people vaccinated with one dose, and 113 residents have been vaccinated with the second dose. Also, according to the DSHS website, as of 3:36pm yesterday, Texas has had 4,469,000 doses allocated, this is an increase of 570,000 since yesterday. Texas has been sent 3,637,500 total doses of the vaccine. This indicates 63,302 doses were sent to Texas since yesterday. Of the vaccines received, 2,446,600 doses have been administered. That is a total of 54.7% of the available vaccine. 1, 947,164 Texas residents have received one dose, and 265,786 have been fully vaccinated.

# Vaccine Efficiency? Herd Immunity?



According to articles in the Texas Tribune, the state's high percentage of residents under 18, most of whom aren't approved for the vaccine, combined with those who can't or won't take it for other reasons, means that the state will struggle to immunize enough Texans to halt the chain of transmission and indirectly protect people who are not immune, experts said. In order for Texas to get to the 70%-80% level that experts estimate is needed would mean vaccinating some 22 million people, or nearly 100% of adults in the state, according to census numbers.

"We do not know when, or if, Texas will reach herd immunity through vaccination," Chief State Epidemiologist Dr. Jennifer Shuford told The Texas Tribune in an emailed statement. "The large proportion of people that are under 18 years old in Texas will impact our ability to reach herd immunity.

But vaccination will begin paying dividends before the state approaches herd immunity because fewer people will end up hospitalized with severe COVID-19 cases. And the state expects that increasing vaccinations will mean less transmission of the virus, health officials said.

Health experts define herd immunity as the minimum portion of the population that must achieve immunity before society can consider the virus defeated — even if it's not eradicated — and return to pre-pandemic lifestyles. (cont'd on back)

However, even reaching that 70-80% benchmark should be celebrated cautiously until more is known about how long a vaccine's immunity might last, said Dr. Nikhil Bhayani, infectious disease specialist at Texas Health Harris Methodist Hospital Alliance. "The key here is that you really want to vaccinate as many people as you can to strive for herd immunity," he said, "but we still have more information that needs to be discovered before we say, 'OK. ... Let's go back to our pre-COVID lives."

#### **Substitute Teacher Shortage**

Administrators, school staff and uncredentialed stand-ins are being



sent into classrooms to cover for teachers who fall ill or have to isolate. But even those improvisations aren't keeping classrooms fully staffed.

Texas school districts, like those across the country, are having trouble keeping their classrooms staffed as teachers stay home for COVID-related quarantine or isolation and the

well of substitute teachers is drier than in past years. Like many other industries requiring in-person work during the pandemic, schools are being disrupted by the persistent employee absences and the inability to easily find replacements. School leaders are coming up with solutions on the fly: tagging in paraprofessionals and administrators to take over for teachers, combining multiple classes in a room and even reverting to virtual school for days at a time.

Texas is now requiring all school districts to offer in-person instruction with few exceptions. But school leaders and teachers know that, even with more students back in classrooms; normalcy is close to impossible until the pandemic is fully under control. "Anything that you're doing that's adding instability to that environment is going to lower your students' ability to uptake knowledge," said Monty Exter, lobbyist for the Association of Texas Professional Educators. "To think that's not going to affect the learning of students whether they're virtual or in person — it's going to impact it."

Assessing students' mental health needs is another layer in this complex situation. School officials say they are noticing that every time a teacher is absent, students wonder if that teacher is dead. "It's kind of like they're constantly braced for someone to die,"
