The Weather



The High yesterday 79° The Low this morning 54°
Hold on to your hats....and your jackets. Forecasters say there is a strong arctic moving south through Kansas and into Oklahoma tonight. Areas west of us may see lows in the upper 40's as the cold front moves in before daybreak tomorrow. Behind the front temperatures will range from near freezing in areas northwest to the mid and upper 40's to the southeast. It looks like Lampasas is on the border where it will be below freezing Wednesday morning and the National Weather Service indicates there may be enough wintry precipitation accumulation to impact elevated roads, bridges and overpasses.

Today: Mostly cloudy with a high near 74°. S-SW wind at 15-20 mph gusting to 30 mph.

Tonight: The chance for showers at 30% before midnight with S winds at 10-15 mph. The low will be near 56°.

Tuesday: The morning will be mostly sunny with a 20% chance of showers and storms after noon. The high temperature will be near 73°. Winds will be SW at 10-15 mph shifting to the N in the afternoon.

Tuesday Night: Winds will be N at 15-20 mph, with 25 mph gusts possible. Skies will be mostly cloudy with a 50% chance of rain and showers and a low near 32°.

Wednesday: Mostly cloudy skies and a high near 41° with a 40% chance of rain in the morning. Winds will be N at 15-20 mph with gusts as high as 25 mph possible.

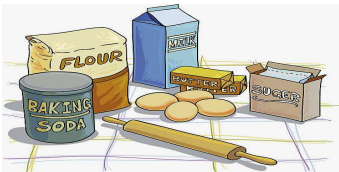
Wednesday Night: Mostly cloudy skies with a low near 27°. Winds will be N-NW at 15-20 mph gusting to 25 mph

I-14 Fatality

Texas DPS sent the following statement to Lampasas Radio : "Texas DPS Troopers responded to a major crash on IH 14 in the westbound lanes approximately 0.1 mile west of the City of Belton. An unidentified white male was reportedly walking WB in the lane of travel on IH 14. The unidentified male was struck by a passing 18-wheeler. The driver of the truck stopped and is cooperating with the investigation. The male was pronounced deceased by JP Cooke at 7:49 a.m. DPS strongly urges motorists traveling westbound to seek alternate routes. Westbound traffic is being diverted to FM 2410 and FM 439 while authorities are conducting the crash investigation. Crash investigation is active and open."



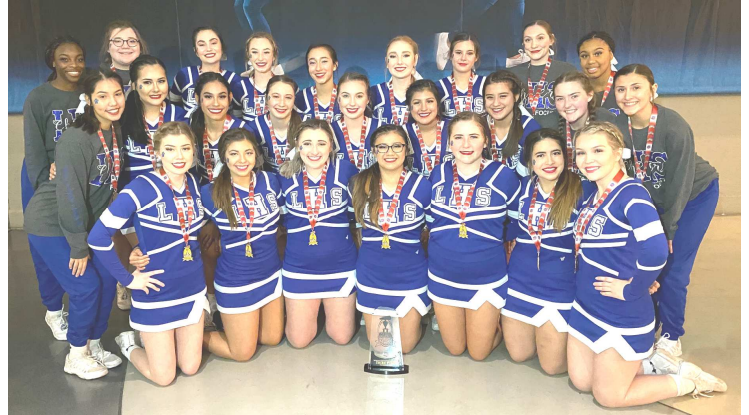

Jail Project Meeting



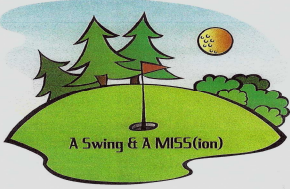
