The Weather

The high yesterday 67° This morning's low 39°

Today: Sunny, with a high near 73°. The south wind that comes today will be from 5-15 mph with some 20 mph gusts.

Tonight: Increasing clouds, with a low around 56° and south wind 10-15 mph and gusting to 20.

Thursday: It will be a just partly cloudy at first, then becoming sunny and the high will soar to about 80° . The SW wind will be 15-20 mph and shift to north in the afternoon with gusts to 25 mph. Overnight, expect the temperature to drop to about 36° and the NE wind will blow hard -10-15 mph and gust to 25. Yes, a cold front has passed through!

The Rest of the Week: By Friday morning the north wind will have slowed to 5-10 mph and the front will move on out with the south breeze returning and the temperature rising into the low to mid 60s.

The weekend will be pretty decent on Saturday, up to the afternoon, when another front will come in and a hard north wind will bring chilling temperatures down to 36° overnight.

Sunday, the north winds get lighter and the breeze will shift back to southerly in the afternoon. The high should be about 63°.

The Lampasas Independent School District held their monthly board meeting on Monday, February 1. A budget amendment was requested for an increase of \$1,538.00 to go towards instruction and co curricular activities. The budget request cost was offset by a decrease in curriculum and instruction costs, as well as revenue from Hanna Springs Elementary. The Board was presented with the quarterly investment report and indicated the first quarter of 2020-21 earned interest in the amount of \$15,833.18. Glenn Shoemaker was awarded a School District Teaching Permit that authorizes him to teach "only noncore academic career and technical education courses based on work experience, formal training and education." The Board ordered the trustee elections to be held on May 1 in conjunction with the County elections. The Board Appointed Mark Bishop as the Early Voting Judge. The voting location judges are Elke White as the Lampasas County Election Office Judge and Frances Gorton as the Kempner Fire Station Judge. The 2021-2022 District calendar was approved with an August 12, 2021 start date and school will commence on May 19, 2022. The District continues to show a strong attendance report with a total attendance rate of over 90%.

Visit with the City Manager

Lampasas City Manger Finley de Graffenried was in Lampasas Radio studios this morning for his weekly visit with Ronnie Witcher

The Lampasas City Manager agreed with Ronnie Witcher that the last few weeks have been eventful. Due to the fact that a few city staff tested positive for Covid-19, and staff quarantine, Lampasas City Hall has been closed since last Wednesday, and Mr. de Graffenreid said it will be open this afternoon or tomorrow

Speaking about the Covid-19 Cases in Lampasas County, they spoke about a spike last week ,and how when we had 10 or 11 in April 2020, we were worried about those numbers.

Mr. de Graffenreid spoke about the immunizations having an impact. Lampasas Radio reached out to Angela Rainwater, Lampasas Emergency Management Coordinator, and she shared that she and Lampasas Fire Dept. Chief Jeff Smith are assisting Dr. Hay with getting the vaccine for FMC and Seton Healthcare on 190. It is a slow process. They have both applied to be a distribution center, but have not been approved. It is also notable that Lampasas 1st Responders have volunteered to assist with giving the vaccines to residents.

The City of Lampasas is currently accepting filings for Mayor and City Council. There are 4 places, those held by Misti Talbert, TJ Monroe, Delana Toups and Mr. Clark. So far Mr. Clark is the only one that filed as an incumbent.

Coronavirus Update

Dr. Georgia Hay shared with Lampasas Radio this morning that Lampasas County currently has 129 active and 1547 total cases with 10 Lampasans in the hospital.

The State of Texas saw 18,951 new confirmed cases yesterday, and 3,133 probable cases. 11,002 Texans are hospitalized with Covid-19 **Vaccinations...**

The DSHS website shows that as of yesterday at 2:36pm, Lampasas County has had 761 people vaccinated with one dose, and 119 residents have been vaccinated with the second dose.

Also, according to the DSHS website, as of 2:36pm yesterday, Texas has had 4,468,600 doses allocated, this is a decrease of 400 doses since yesterday. Texas has been sent 3,714,650 total doses of the vaccine. This indicates 63,302 doses were sent to Texas since yesterday. Of the vaccines received, 2,446,600 doses have been administered. That is a total of 54.7% of the available vaccine. 1,947,164 Texas residents have received one dose, and 265,786 have been fully vaccinated.
