The Weather



Yesterday's high 76° This morning's low 55°

Today: Early morning fog turns to a mostly sunny day with a high near 80° and W-SW wind 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy, with a low around 60° and south wind 5-10 mph.

Tuesday: Patchy drizzle before noon, then mostly cloudy with a high near 75° and south wind 5-15 mph and gusty.

Patchy drizzle after midnight, then mostly cloudy with a low around 63° and south wind 10 mph.

Rest of the week: Wednesday will bring more patchy drizzle with a slight chance of a real shower in the morning. Otherwise, mostly cloudy with a high around 76° and very windy. Wednesday night, there is a 60% chance of real rain. That rain chance drops to 30% on Thursday as a cold front shows up in the afternoon.

The winds will be high on Thursday and thru the overnight as that cold front brings temperatures way down to a low Thursday night of 31° and a high Friday of 45°. The front will pass through over the weekend with rain chances off and on, then by Monday it should change again.

The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Saturday showed a theft report from the 1700 block of CTE at midnight. At 2:05am a 28 yr old Lampasas man was arrested on Bellaire Dr. on a municipal court warrant over a speeding case. Another municipal court warrant brought the arrest of a 34 yr old Lampasas woman. She had 11 outstanding warrants for everything from speeding to driving without a valid license, no insurance, and for possession of drug paraphernalia.

The afternoon saw a reckless driver reported in the 2300 block of Hwy 183 S. at 2:32pm and the evening brought a Key Ave. traffic stop arrest where a 40 yr old man from Rosanky, TX was arrested for violation of an occupational license. That was at 8:07pm. There was a suspicious vehicle report in the 100 block of E. 2nd at 9:54pm and at 11:56pm, a 27 yr old Killeen man was arrested in the 1400 block of FM580E. The man was charged with possession of under 28 grams of Alprazolam, a PG3 controlled substance commonly known as Xanax. Possession of it, without a prescription, is a Class A misdemeanor punishable by up to a year in jail.

The Boys JV team will also be up against Academy, likely at 4pm, on Tuesday.

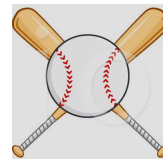
Badger Softball
