The Weather



The High yesterday 57° The Morning Low 42°

Today: Mostly cloudy this morning then gradual clearing with a high near 69°. Winds will be SW at 10-15 mph. A low is expected to move through today bringing a cold front and a sharp wind shift to the N-NW with winds at 15-20mph in the afternoon, with possible gusts of 30 mph.

Tonight: Mostly clear and a low around 33° the strong N-NW wind will become light in the overnight. The light winds and dry airmass will allow for the cool overnight temperatures.

Sunday: Sunny, with a high near 68° and S wind at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Overnight Sunday: A low near 44° and the S winds continue. **Next Week:** After a warm Monday, the first of a series of cold fronts is expected Monday night into Tuesday. The forecasters say from Tuesday on depends on where a cold front stalls. There are 2 scenarios; one where Arctic air moves into our forecast area and sets up the possibility of freezing rain and sleet across much of the area Wednesday evening through Thursday. The other scenario would keep the Arctic air north and cause the surface boundary to move north and south across our forecast area providing more rain chances and storm potential. (The forecasters are leaning to the colder forecast at this time).

Mason County Courthouse Arsonist Captured

According to various news reports from dailytrib in Burnet County and KCEN in Waco, Mason Volunteer Firefighters were called to a house fire at about 10:15pm. A dispatcher for the county saw flames shooting out of the top of the Mason County Courthouse a short time later.

According to reports, the house on Rand St. belonged to the

suspect's uncle. (Suspect Nicholas Jarret Miller, right).

According to DPS, a Georgetown Police officer tried to stop the Ford F-350 the suspect was driving on I-35. The truck fled, and DPS took over the pursuit in Jarrell.

KNEL Radio out of Brady reports that throughout most of the pursuit

on I-35, the suspect, Nicholas Miller, was on Facebook Live describing the chase, complaining about his personal life and relationship and disparaging law enforcement.



During the pursuit, Miller continually asked about the condition of his two boys. At the end of the chase, Miller said, "cause they tell me my kids are all right, that means I have to drop my hands. Y'all understand that, right."

Miller stopped and surrendered at mile marker 328 South of Waco. McLennan county jail records show he is charged with two 3rd-degree felonies, evading arrest w/vehicle, and unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon. Charges in the Mason County fires are expected.

Meetings Monday

The Lampasas County Commissioners' Court will hold a regular meeting Monday at 9am in the Commissioners' Courtroom at the Lampasas Courthouse.

The Agenda includes the consent agenda, accounts payable/ payroll; bonds for the County Auditor and Constable Dennis James; Appointing a local health authority, a fireworks order, some travel reimbursement, business with River Hills Ranches III, some Kempner Water Supply lines on county roads, a request for the City of Lampasas to make a road cut on CR 1045 for a 2" water main, a request of a Criminal Justice Assistance Grant, and, of course, the Jail Project.

The Lampasas City Council will meet Monday evening for a workshop and a regular session beginning at 5:30pm. The agenda for the workshop session includes; discussion of comprehensive plan status and priorities, planning a date to tour city facilities, and the Hostess House.

Council will then begin the regular meeting which includes the consent agenda, the first reading of an ordinance regarding an SUP for property at 8 Chris James, to allow for an accessory dwelling in an area zoned single family residential -10. And the second reading of an ordinance calling for a General Election on May 1, 2021. Alos included are board & departmental reports, routine matters to include the city manager's operational report, and mayor's comments. New business includes discussion and consideration of the following; the SUP at 8 Chris James, a Spring Ho Resolution, the Lampasas Police Dept. Annual Racial Profiling report, and a TxCDBG Contract.

Lampasas could easily win both those games and go into the playoffs as a 2^{nd} seed team.
