## The Weather

High yesterday was 66° Low this morning was 37°



It should be a pretty day with southerly winds returning. Wind speed will pickup this afternoon and evening bringing with it humidity. It looks like it will get cloudy this afternoon, but high temperatures should still be in the mid 60's. That cloud cover will keep our low temperatures in the 50's tonight. Sunday's high is forecast to be near 70°, while on Monday and Tuesday the high temperatures will be in the 40's and 50's.

Welcome to Texas.....

**Today:** Increasing clouds with winds from the N-NE at 5-10 mph shifting SE in the afternoon. The high temperature will be near 65°.

**Tonight:** Cloudy with S winds at 5-15 mph gusting to 20 mph. The low will be near 53°. Drizzle is possible early Sunday morning.

**Sunday:** Cloudy with a high temperature near 69°. S wind at 15 mph gusting to 25 mph. Look for patchy drizzle in the morning, then a 40% chance of showers and storms in the afternoon.

**Sunday Night:** A low temperature near 48° and mostly cloudy skies. Winds will be W-SW at 5-10 mph shifting N at 10-15 mph after midnight with gusts as high as 20 mph. There is a 50% chance of showers and storms.

**Monday:** A 60% chance of rain and showers and a possible thunderstorm in the afternoon. Skies will be cloudy with the temperature falling into the upper 40's by late morning. Wind will be N at 10-15 mph with gusts as high as 20 mph.

**Monday Night:** A low near 41° and cloudy skies with N winds at 10 mph. There is a 60% chance of showers and storms overnight.

## Missing Child Found

**The Lampasas County Sheriff's Office sent the following information:**

On 2/7/20 at 5:15pm, a parent contacted the Sheriff's Office to report her daughter had not made it home from school. They reside in the 5000 block of FM 580E, the parent contacted the Transportation Dept. at Lampasas ISD and learned the child had been dropped off as usual. At 6:34pm, a land owner in the 4800 block of FM580E when a child knocked on the door and asked to use the restroom. The home owner, Brandon Butts, said he did not have a bathroom but he would call her mother. The child refused assistance, and Mr. Butts finding this strange took a cell phone photo of the child and called the Sheriff's Dept. The local law enforcement was using drones, and deputies and a constable patrolled the roads, others walked through the woods. Then nightfall set in. Luckily the child had her cell phone, and law enforcement was able to utilize the GPS locating system, and were able to pinpoint where the cell phone was located. The GPS indicated a residence in the 4700 block of FM580E. The Sheriff's office arrived at that residence, and the parents were very cooperative and allowed the sheriff's office to search the residence and outbuildings. The missing child was located hiding

in their daughter's bedroom. The child was returned home to mom. Thanks to the hard work of the Lampasas County Sheriff's Office, Deputies, Investigators and communications officers, Lampasas Police Dept., and Precinct 1 Constable for their efforts. A special thanks to Brandon Butts for becoming involved and reporting his suspicions that proved to be very beneficial to all law enforcement agencies involved.


