The Weather



The High yesterday 32° The Low this morning 32°

Today: A 30% chance of rain, clouds and cold, with a high of only about 36°. The wind will be out of the east and light at about 5-10 mph.

Tonight: A 40% chance of rain, otherwise cloudy and down to about 35°. The wind will be light at 5 mph.

Sunday: A 40% chance of rain again, clouds, but warming up, getting up to around 54° in the afternoon. The light wind will be out of the SE.

Overnight the rain chances decrease a little and the overnight low should be around 38°.

Next week: Monday's long range forecast has the 30% rain chance in it but the afternoon high forecast calls for about 70° with southerly winds. Then...we see another blip in the forecast with a wind shift to northerly early Tuesday morning. Tuesday's high will be held at about 61° while a weak cold front passes through. It should be gone by Wednesday and by Thursday we'll be back to the 70s..

Be careful as roads are slick, whether it's from ice or just drizzle, it does require cautious driving.



Avoid the Hwy 195 path into Georgetown/Austin today.

Lady Badgers Fans to head for Johnson City on Monday.



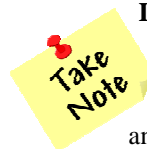

On the agenda is the appointment of a local health authority, towing rules and regulations, the annual ambulance service report, the use of a county office space for the District 54 Representative, a finance agreement with Bancorp South Eqpt. Finance, the donation of a 2013 patrol truck to the San Saba S.O., firework sales for July 4th, Bloomin' Fest on the square and more.

Lampasas City Council will meet at 5:30pm Monday to discuss items, including the litigations with Kempner Water Supply Corp., the Council's work plan, the Nix Water Tank rehab and the Chamber of Commerce 1st Qtr. report. In regular session they'll discuss or have public hearings on some zoning or property issues, set up the May Council and Local Option Election, discuss a Chamber if Commerce request for HOT funds to put on the annual Bloomin' Fest event in April and other funding matters. One, costing \$35,000, would install some 500 radio read water meters.

Funeral/Death Notices

Joe W.G. Behlau was born April 13, 1923 in Rochester, NY to Walter George Behlau and Mable (Knapp) Behlau. Joe was the second of four children; their mother died at the birth of the last. The children were raised by their father and their grandmother who was born in Germany. Joe's father lost his nursery business during the great depression and the children sold their Grandmother's baked goods door to door; their Father eventually got a job as manager of the nursery dept at Sears-Roebuck.

Often as many as three families of relatives lived in a house together pooling their resources. Joe grew up spending most days at the nearest WPA built swimming pool. Before entering the 9th grade, he won the Rochester Junior Diving Championship. When he attended West High School in Rochester, he was twice recognized as an All-American diver.

During WWII, Joe volunteered for the Army Air Corps and flew as a navigator. At the end of the war, he had attained the rank of Captain in the U.S. Air Force. He was awarded an Air Medal with 3 Oak leaf clusters and a Purple Heart while flying 35 missions over Germany.

Joe was discharged in 1947 and entered Washington State College on a swimming scholarship. In 1951 after having completed a semester at Gonzaga Law School in Spokane, he was recalled to the Air Force for the Korean War. While instructing at Randolph Field in San Antonio in 1952 he met and married Bobbye Alexander of Lampasas. He was discharged again as a Lt. Colonel in the reserves and remained in the reserves until he retired in 1983. He finished his B.S. degree at St. Mary's University in San Antonio and started another career as a golf pro. That career included building several facilities and designing one as well. In 2005 the Behlau's retired in Lampasas and attended St. Mary's Episcopal Church and promoted the Keystone Square Museum and Preservation Lampasas. Joe was a life member of the Professional Golf Association, a charter member of the WWII Memorial in Louisiana, a member of the Purple Heart Association in San Antonio and the American Legion in Lampasas.

He was a patriot and so believed in the two party system of government that he always contributed to both Democratic and Republican Parties. He was preceded in death by his wife of 65 years, Bobbye Alexander Behlau. He is survived by his son, Robert Alexander Behlau of Aquilla, TX, nephews Edward Behlau of Arlington and Jerry Behlau of Rochester, NY

A funeral service will be held Wednesday Feb. 13, at 11am at St. Mary's Episcopal Church in Lampasas. Burial will be in Davis Cemetery near Briggs. Visitation will be Tuesday Feb. 12th, 5-7pm at Sneed Funeral Chapel.
