The Weather

Today: The arctic air has started to arrive, and is expected to be here for the next 6-7 days. Today will be cloudy with drizzle, possible mixed with freezing drizzle, then ending. The high temperature will be near 47°, and winds will be N-NE at 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Cloudy with a low near 39° and drizzle expected late in the night. Wind will be NE at 5-10 mph.

Lampasas Police Chief Sammy Bailey shared with Lampasas Radio that the charges were all combined to create a felony charge, due to the amount of damage.

Lampasas Sheriff's Dept. blotter for Monday shows Lometa with animal issues. Kempner dealt with medical calls, an accident, reports of suspicious activity, animal issues, a repossession and an open door or gate. Out in the county there were animal issues, an accident, civil matters, reported threats, a reported fraud, a reported harassment and a noise complaint. Deputies went into Cove on a civil matter.

The Jail Log shows the arrest of 20 year old Felicia Evans of Temple, for failure to ID a fugitive w/intent to give false information.

The Burn Ban has been lifted until February 15th

to stabilize and offered a glimmer of hope that we may soon be able to operate at 75% occupancy. Chief Smith also noted that both Rollings Brook Hospital and Family Medicine Clinic are both authorized to administer vaccines. He did caution though, that although approved, FMC does not currently have admissible vaccines and the timeline to receive them is unknown. Council approved an ambitious timeline to proceed with the Comprehensive Plan Status, Priorities and Implementations submitted at the last council meeting. On February 16, 2021, an advertisement will be posted for a March 4 & 8 public hearing and considerations for the Plan. The Hostess House was surveyed by Hendrix Consulting Engineers for a robust remodel to allow for updating safety concerns and user enjoyment. Council discussed the potential cost of such a project. While the cost is unknown right now, it was agreed that the historical aspects of the building should be maintained. The first reading of Shawn and Dianne Kirk's permit and petition for an accessory use building was approved at 8 Chris James Lane. City Manager Finley deGraffenried reports that our sales tax revenue continues to rise. We are currently at a 20% higher increase from a year ago. It pays to buy local! The Spring Ho Committee's recommendation for Spring Ho to be held from July 5-11 was approved and granted. Police Chief Sammy Bailey gave a detailed racial profiling in policing report. The summary is, as Chief Bailey said, "Lampasas does not have a racial profiling problem, nor a culture of racial profiling." Lampasas was awarded a grant through the Texas Department of Agriculture to help fund city improvements. Langford Community Management Services was solicited to provide administrative services and oversight for the 2021-2022 Community Development Block Grant
