Today: Cloudy skies with gradual clearing and a high temperature that will top out near 71°. Wind will be S at 15-20 mph gusting to 35 mph.

Tonight: Cloudy skies with gradual clearing and a low near 55°. There is a 50% chance of showers and storms overnight. Wind will be S-SE at 15-20 mph with possible gusts of 35 mph.

Thursday: Look for sunny skies and a temperature falling to near 47° by 5pm. Winds from the W-SW will shift to the N and will be gusty at 15-20 mph gusting to 30 mph.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on February 11th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 28 cases were brought to the court with 24 cases involving men, and 4 cases involving women.

Dakota Price, on the charge of abandon/endangering a child/criminal negligence failed to appear. Also Todd Miller was FTA on the charge of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon. Robert Defelice on the charge of possession of a controlled substance was also FTA.

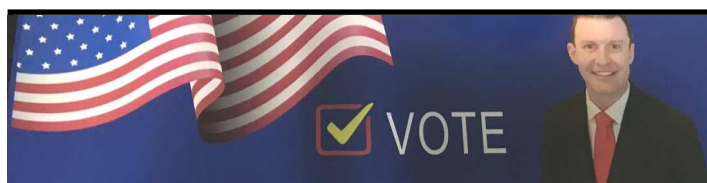
There were 8 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 4 cases for less than a gram, 3 cases for 1-4 grams and one case for 4-200 grams. There were 4 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1/1B less than a gram and one case for possession of a controlled substance, PG 2 less than a gram. There were 2 DWI cases.

There was one case each for bail jumping/FTA, burglary, prohibited substance in a correctional facility and engaging in organized criminal activity.

In cases causing personal harm there were 2 cases of assault of a family/household member. There was one case each for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, abandon/endanger child/criminal negligence, and intoxication manslaughter with a vehicle. There was one case for aggravated sexual assault of a child, and 3 cases of indecency with a child/sexual contact.

Of the 28 cases, 3 cases were resolved with Jerry Pickens receiving 5 years probation on the charge of engaging in organized criminal activity, plus restitution and court costs. John Lockhart, on 2 charges of indecency with a child/sexual contact saw a sentence for 2 years at TDCJ handed down on one count, and he was sentenced to 10 years probation plus court costs and fines on the other charge.

All other cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.



The Burn Ban is in Effect!

Fire Danger

COLLEGE STATION, Texas—Wildfire activity is expected to increase through Wednesday as an active weather pattern aligns with dry vegetation across the landscape.

A strong front will move across the state bringing increased winds, temperatures and fire danger in cured grasses across the landscape for western portions of the state, including the areas in the High Plains and Rolling Plains around Wichita Falls, San Angelo, Lubbock and Amarillo.

Over the past seven days, state and local resources responded to 176 wildfires that burned 8,418 acres. The uptick in activity was the result of increased wind speeds over dry fuels.

In preparation for potential wildfire activity this week, Texas A&M Forest Service has fully staffed task forces and suppression equipment staged in Childress, Amarillo, Lubbock, San Angelo, Burkburnett, Fredericksburg, Smithville, McGregor, San Angelo and Mineral Wells.

Additional agency personnel and overhead, including incident commanders with advanced qualifications, are prepositioned across areas of concern.

“Rapid response and the use of appropriate resources is essential in preventing large, destructive wildfires,” said Wes Moorehead, Texas A&M Forest Service Fire Chief. “Our agency strategically prepositions personnel and equipment across areas of concern where they can respond to requests for assistance from local fire departments who serve as Texas’ first line of defense.”

Two large airtankers, three single engine air tankers, two type 3 helicopters, two air attack platforms and two aerial supervision modules are staged in state to assist with wildfire response efforts.
