Lometa ISD School Board Meeting

The Lometa ISD Board of Trustees will hold a regular meeting on February 17th at 6:30pm in the Lometa School Library.

The agenda includes community input, recognition of students and staff members of the month, a public hearing on the Texas Academic Performance Report, a six month review of return to in-person instruction and continuity of services plan, significant changes to CDC guidance, update of safety recommendations, a presentation from Sports Design Group for construction and upgrades of athletic facilities. Also included will be consideration of bids for construction of cafeteria storage shed and addition of concrete for ramp to cafeteria loading dock as well as upgrades to the athletic shed.

Special Election May 7th

(Texas Tribune) Texas voters will decide whether to lower some property taxes that fund schools in a May 7 special election.

Two propositions will be on the statewide ballot. Gov. Greg Abbott officially set the upcoming election date Wednesday.

The first proposition would draw down property taxes for elderly and disabled Texans by reducing the amount they pay to public schools, which typically makes up most of a homeowner's tax bill. The state would then cover that reduced revenue for school districts. The measure would cost the state more than \$744 million from 2024 to 2026.

The second measure would raise Texas' homestead exemption from \$25,000 to \$40,000 for school district property taxes, which would save the average homeowner about \$176 on their annual property tax bill. If approved, this measure would cost the state \$600 million annually. The state will use a \$4.4 billion surplus to pay for the measure's first-year cost, but as of October, it was unclear where future funding would come from.

Fentanyl In Texas

Governor Greg Abbott today held a roundtable in Fort Worth on the national fentanyl crisis alongside law enforcement and families who have been affected by fentanyl. During the roundtable, the Governor listened to the stories of families who have endured the pain of losing a loved one to fentanyl overdose and discussed the ways state and local law enforcement are working to stop this deadly drug from entering our communities.

The Governor and roundtable attendees discussed the heartbreaking statistics surrounding the fentanyl crisis. In 2021 alone, there were over 1,334 fentanyl-related deaths in Texas. Provisional data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Center for Cow/Calf Pairs -Health Statistics documented an estimated 100,306 drug overdose deaths in the United States during a 12-month period that ended in April 2021—a significant increase of 28.5% from the same period the year prior. The new data also shows that estimated overdose deaths from opioids, including synthetics like fentanyl, increased to 75,673 in the same 12-month period, up from 56,064 the year before. The discussion also included a conversation about the influx of counterfeit pills and contaminated drugs in communities that are causing many individuals to unknowingly ingest fentanyl, leading to a rise in poisoning and overdoses.

Governor Abbott has taken significant action to address the fentanyl crisis in Texas. Under Operation Lone Star, which launched in March 2021, over 232 million deadly doses of fentanyl have been seized coming across the border. Governor Abbott also signed new legislation last year that enhances criminal penalties for

manufacturing and distributing fentanyl in Texas
