# The Weather

Yesterday's high 59° (10am) This morning's low 27°

Today: Some relief from the strong winds and lots of sunshine with an afternoon high near 55°. The wind, still out of the north, should hang at 5-10 mph.

Tonight: The sky will be clear and the low near 59° with the wind completely calm.

Saturday: There shouldn't be much change except a few degrees warmer with a 64° high. The calm wind will kick up to perhaps 5 mph in the afternoon but it will have shifted to a SE breeze. Overnight it will be south breeze at 5 mph and a low of 39-40°.

Rest of the weekend: Sunday should be nice with a high near 69° and a southerly breeze that could gust a little in the afternoon. Monday, Washington's Birthday, will be sunny and up to 81°.

Monday night, good news perhaps, it seems we have a 30% chance of rain. That will be gone by Tuesday when sunshine and a nice morning will give way to another cold front. But, that could bring rain chances again through mid-week...

#### TGIF! - What's Going On?

It's all about politics right now with plenty for Lampasas voters to do. Early Voting is going on during office hours at the County Elections Office on Pecan Street on the east side of the square. There are hotly contested elections in the Republican Primary for Justice of the Peace Precinct 1, Justice of the Peace Precinct 4 and for County Clerk. There are three candidates for every contest. There are also races for House and Senate seats, and it is Gubernatorial Election Year with Gov. Abbott facing challenges.

And coming up, there are the City and School elections. There are City Council and School Board candidates signing up to run.

Let's talk about the weather. It's February of '22 and the drought picture doesn't look any better now than it did in January, or December, or November... and so-on. We've had just under a half inch of rain so far in February. The typical mark for this point should have been twice that much at least. In January we received only .6 in. of rain, about a third of a 30 yr. normal. But looking back at December, there was only .03 in. of rain. That was hardly a trace, when we should have gotten over 2 inches.

So what's up with all this? It's dear old La Nina! She's doing

what she's supposed to, according to the weather gurus with the National Weather Service - Cold and blizzards, rain and snow in the north parts of the U.S. and dry in the southern states. And that's exactly what we got!

It seems there's some hope for relief from La Nina's grip in May and June, but for now we are just gonna tough it out, pray for rain, and think about building rainfall capture systems for when it does come.

The chances of that...pretty good for next week!


