The High yesterday 39° The Low this morning 35°
Light NW wind & cloudy at 7am after .01 in. drizzle Tuesday.

Today: Partly sunny and up to about 60° this afternoon, not as nice as earlier thought but still nicer than it has been. The W-NW wind will shift to NE this afternoon.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy and down to about 40° with E-SE wind of 5mph becoming calm after midnight.

Thursday: Mostly cloudy with a high about 56° and E-SE wind 5-10 mph. Overnight the rain chances come back, this time with a 50-50 probability after midnight. Otherwise mostly cloudy and down to about 46° with E-SE wind 5-10.

Rest of the week: Friday the rain chance is up to 70% in our forecast, along with a high of about 64° and light southerly wind.

Saturday looks like a 20% rain chance now, and that should go away by morning. It will be windy, with W-NW wind getting up to 20-25 mph Saturday morning and gusting to 35 mph. That will let up a little in the evening and should be all but gone on Sunday when it will warm to the mid 60s, and go through Tuesday.

District Court Records



District Court on February 15th in Lampasas saw 40 cases come before the bench. Fifteen cases were reset, seven were set for pre-trial activity in March, and three were set for jury announcements. Elijah Helzer, and Jennifer Murrill failed to appear and warrants were issued. Lee Anthony Garcia saw his bond reduced, and suppression hearings were scheduled for Michael Erickson and Michael Westbrook.

Three cases saw sentencing as Michael Ray Pierce of Lampasas was sentenced to 5 years deferred adjudication probation for possession of a controlled substance under 1 gram. Miguel Ayala was sentenced to 10 days in the county jail with credit for time served, for possession of marijuana more than 4 ounces but less than 5 lbs. Bryan Snyder of Lometa was sentenced with having his probation revoked and 12 months in state jail plus costs with credit for time served, on two charges of unauthorized use of a vehicle.

In an interesting addendum to court records above concerning one of the accused, we received this information from the Lampasas County Sheriff's Office:

"On 2/15/2019 at approximately 3:15pm, a Lampasas County inmate, Eric James Morales, H/M 29yoa, attacked two Lampasas County Detention Officers while they attempted to move him from the jail recreational area to his jail cell. Inmate Morales refused to cooperate and threw punches at the Assistant Jail Administrator and the Detention Sergeant as they attempted to place him in handcuff restraints. The Detention Sergeant was struck in the eye by inmate Morales' closed fist. Inmate Morales was tackled and taken to the ground." The release goes on to say that the prisoner was subdued and one of the officers went to the ER to receive treatment for minor injuries. It also notes that additional charges had been filed against the prisoner for assault on a public servant. The original charges that had seen Morales go to jail were for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon causing serious bodily injury to a family member.
