# The Weather



### High yesterday was $60^\circ\,$ The low this morning was $41^\circ\,$

**Today:** A 20% chance of a shower before 3pm, otherwise cloudy with a high near  $55^{\circ}$  and east wind 5-10 mph.

**Tonight:** A 40% chance of rain, probably after midnight, cloudy, light wind and down to around 46° by morning.

**Friday:** A 60% chance of rain, probably mid-morning, up to  $61^{\circ}$  in the afternoon, and light E-SE wind turning SE in the afternoon and SW after midnight. Overnight temps should be in the 50s.

**The Weekend:** Saturday will bring another light rain chance. The temperature should get up to  $67^{\circ}$  in the afternoon and the sky should be at least partly sunny. Sunday should be rain-free, but a bit cooler, down to  $62^{\circ}$  for the high.

# **Texas Legislature Mulling Over Big Deals**



# And, there's even more problems after property tax and school funding.

Here are just some of the problems the Texas legislature is wrestling with:

The Governor and legislature top dogs started big discussions as the legislative session began by proposing a rule that would limit local government's from raising property taxes more than 2.5% in any year without a vote by the taxpayers to approve the hike.

That sounded good to most taxpayers, but cities and counties and school districts, as expected, immediately came out against it. They, through their lobby organizations, sent word to their Representatives that it should be opposed. And, that has happened, with most of the Texas house and senate leaders say it's a no-way deal. But, with most property tax constituents wanting something done, they do seem to be able to talk about some kind of "deal."

School Finance is the other big deal, with schools all over the state complaining about the lack of enough funding, or the "Robin Hood" system that sees wealthy school district's having to send some of their money out to poorer districts. There are plenty of reasons to complain, and districts have been doing it for years. The "gist" is that some believe the state should totally fund schools, while another extreme is that schools should be totally funded, and controlled, by local district taxpayers. Right now it's a mix with a push toward more "state" funding, but the big question is "where will the state get the money?" That becomes even more complicated with the push to lower local property taxes. What to do???

Not discussed as much is another big problem, Pension Funding. There are lots of different schemes to fund retirement pensions. With the last several years of failures of pension systems, businesses and governments in the U.S. have learned that making absolute guarantees about retirement funds are dangerous. The vast

majority of both government and business pension systems have gone away from these Defined Benefit (DP), guaranteed plans. They have, instead, gone to hybrid plans that are generally called Defined Contribution (DC) or other modified plans that depend on how well the pension funds do with their investments and how long the employees had actually been employed, etc. These plans may guarantee employer contributions, and do their best, but don't really guarantee an outcome.

What kind of problem does Texas have? Texas state employee pensions, included the Teacher Retirement system and other state and local public employee systems that are handled by the state, <u>make guarantees</u>. And, they are generally underfunded. The Texas Comptroller is warning that, down the road, Texas is going to face a big problem as the funds are losing ground fast. If the Legislature doesn't do something to change the plans or start funding them out of the public pocket, there is going to be a big problem.

# Teacher Resigns After Misdemeanor Arrest

Lampasas Middle School teacher Christie Miller resigned on Wednesday from her job teaching 7<sup>th</sup> grade Science classes. According to Lampasas School Superintendent Dr. Chane Rascoe, there was a report on Monday that an inappropriate and perhaps illegal behaviour incident had taken place. He turned the matter over to law enforcement to see if the report had any merit. On Wednesday, at around 3pm, Ms. Miller was arrested and charged with "purchasing and or furnishing alcohol to a minor." She was immediately released on a bond arrangement and, at that time according to the Superintendent, Ms. Miller resigned her teaching position with the Lampasas ISD.
