The Weather



High yesterday was 55°

Low this morning was 41° (at just after midnight)

The forecasters tell us that the low temperatures in the cloudy areas were in the lower 40's, while areas that have clear skies had lows in the low 30's. However, everyone is expected to warm up today with the south winds and the sun peeking out now and again. A cold front is expected to come through the area Sunday night and early Monday morning. There may be some light rain, but we should all be rain-free by daybreak Monday. But wait... there's more! A stronger cold front will be here on Tuesday, with very blustery north-northwest winds of 15-25 mph with higher gusts Tuesday night and into Wednesday. With the lows expected to be in the 30's, wind chills will be in the 20's. They are monitoring the system and will issue wind advisories if necessary.

Today: Partly sunny with winds from the S at 10-15 mph. The high temperature will be near 59°.

Tonight: Cloudy with S-SE winds at 5-10 mph. The low will be near 49°.

Sunday: Cloudy with a high temperature near 65°.

S wind at 10-15 mph. There is a 20% chance of rain in the afternoon.

Sunday Night: A low temperature near 51° and mostly cloudy skies. Winds will be S at 10-15 mph shifting to the W in the early morning.

Monday: Skies will be sunny with the high temperature near 67°. Wind will be NW at 10-15 mph with gusts as high as 20 mph.

Monday Night: A low near 40° and clear skies with NW winds at 5 mph dying down in the evening.

Tuesday: Sunny with a high near 63°. Wind will be light and variable becoming N at 10-15 early in the day with gusts as high as 20 mph.

Monday Meetings

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court will have a regular meeting this Monday at 9am at the Lampasas County Courthouse. The agenda includes the consent agenda including accounts payable & payroll, a request bid for Gas & Diesel @ station, discussion of the 100% Disabled Veterans Exemption, and consultation with the project architect and legal counsel regarding default of contract for the Jail Project by Krueger Construction Company. (The Court may go into Executive Session for this part of the meeting.)

The Commissioners will then have a called meeting at 10:30am in the conference room at the annex to discuss the Professional Lawn Care & Grounds Maintenance bids. This is an optional pre-bid meeting.

The Lampasas City Council will have a workshop session at 5:30pm. The agenda for the workshop session includes an update regarding Pecan Street Development and possible amendments to the zoning regulations. Also on the agenda is discussion regarding making application for a Texas Historical Commission designation



for the Jack Calvert Municipal Building.

The regular session agenda includes a public hearing to receive citizen comments about an ordinance regulating outdoor burning within the city limits of Lampasas. Establishing allowable materials, rules, regulations, setting burn permit fees, penalties for violations, an effective date and providing an open meeting clause. Monthly reports and routine matters will also be discussed. After the public hearing on the burning ordinance, there will be a possible first reading of said ordinance. Discussion to apply for Federal Grant Programs for hiring of Police Officers through the COPS hiring program. Possible action regarding the historical designation for the Jack Calvert Building, discussion regarding renewal of the Right of Access and Use Agreement between the City of Lampasas and the Little League Association, discussion and considering for approval a Lampasas Economic Development Project related to Life Safety Grants for Commercial Businesses in existing buildings, and consideration/approval to utilize Hotel Occupancy Tax funds of not more than \$5000 for downtown 'LTX' signs.

The Blotter

Warrant Round Up

The Lampasas Municipal Court will be conducting a "Warrant Resolution Drive" from February 24th to March 13th. They encourage the public to take steps to resolve their cases as soon as possible.

If you are concerned that you have a warrant, or have received a ticket, and are not sure what your options are, please contact the Lampasas Municipal Court at 512-556-4909.

Municipal Court continues to be a "Safe Harbor Court" which means that the persons may appear to resolve their outstanding cases without the fear of being arrested. If they plead "Not Guilty" they must post the required bond and receive a trial setting. Defendants may be eligible for alternative methods to discharging their fines and costs.

If you do not have the resourced to immediately pay, they may request an extension of their time. Start a payment plan or request community service to pay for part or all of their obligations.
