## District Court Notes

**Lampasas County Courthouse** was the site of a 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Docket Call on February 18th. Presiding over the Court was 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 13 cases were brought to the court with 10 cases involving men, and 3 cases involving women.

A total of 4 defendants failed to appear for a total of 6 cases.

Lorenzo Vargas of Leander failed to appear on a charge of possession of a controlled substance PG 1 1-4 grams. Quincell Rahmings of Temple failed to appear on 2 charges; engaging in organized criminal activity and evading arrest. Humberto Barcenas of Goldthwaite failed to appear on the charges of possession of a controlled substance PG 2 4-400 grams and also on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG 1 4-200 grams. James Teer of Houston failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG 1 1-4 grams.

There were 6 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 2 cases for less than a gram, 3 cases for 1-4 grams and one case for 4-200 grams. There was one case for possession of a controlled substance PG 2 4-400 grams.

There was one case each for engaging in organized criminal activity and evading arrest. There were 2 cases for theft and 2 cases for burglary.

Of the 13cases, 1 case was resolved with Lee Myers of Lampasas seeing his probation modified due to the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams

All other cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.

## Gas Prices on the Increase

Gas prices are continuing to climb and could get "rather ugly" in the coming weeks, according to GasBuddy.com.

In the Harrisburg, Pennsylvania area, prices have increased 6.3 cents a gallon in the past week for an average price of \$3.72 a gallon today.

According to GasBuddy, gas prices in central Pa. are 22.3 cents a gallon higher than a month ago and 87.6 cents higher than a year ago.

The national average price of gas has increased 3 cents a gallon in the last week, averaging \$3.51 a gallon today.

"With tensions still very high that Russia may invade Ukraine, gasoline prices kept moving higher, tugged by the rising price of oil as the market concentrates on possible outcomes from the situation that could affect global oil production amidst recovering demand," said Patrick De Haan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy.



# The Blotter



**Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Tuesday** shows a reported theft in the 1900 block of S. Chestnut at 11:59am, an assault by threat reported in the 2300 block of 281S at 1:39pm and suspicious activity reported in the 600 block of E. Ave F at 2:06pm. There was a report of found property in the 900 block of S. Broad St. at 3:36pm and a theft reported in the 1700 block of CTE at 5:07pm. There was one arrest at Brian Powell, 40, of Lampasas was arrested in the 1300 block of CTE on 2 Lampasas Municipal Warrants (Possession of drug paraphernalia and theft of property less than \$150) at 6:49pm. There was a reported theft in the 1200 block of W. 4<sup>th</sup> St. at 7:46pm.

**The Lampasas County Sheriff's Blotter** for Tuesday shows Lometa with animal issues. In Kempner there were reports of suspicious activity, medical calls, civil matters and a reported harassment. Out in the county there were animal issues, an unattended death, medical calls, an accident, and civil matters. Deputies went into Cove on civil matters, a reported fraud, to deliver a message, livestock issues and a reported disturbance.

**The Jail Log** shows the arrest of 39 year old Jessie Cressman of Kempner for 2 charges of theft of property. Brent Gallagher, 33, was booked in on a commitment charge.

**From the Copperas Cove Police Dept.:** "On February 21, 2022 at approximately 2:30 AM, Copperas Cove Police Officers were dispatched to the 400 block of E Ave D in reference to a business alarm. Upon arrival, officers discovered several businesses had been burglarized. As officers were canvassing the area, they located a vehicle in a nearby parking lot with two occupants inside. During the investigation, officers conducted a probable cause search of the vehicle and discovered items stolen from the burglaries. The two suspects admitted to their involvement in the burglaries. They were identified as James Darell Lincoln (below left) and Isaac John Allan, (below right) both residents of Copperas Cove. Both suspects were taken into custody without incident, and were each charged with four counts of Burglary of a Building. On February 22, 2022, James Darell Lincoln and Isaac John Allan were arraigned by Justice of the Peace John Guinn and each received a total bond of \$40,000, \$10,000 per charge. The Copperas Cove Police Department continues to investigate this incident."



"However, with nuclear talks between Iran and global powers ongoing in Vienna, the possibility exists that a new deal could bring Iran's crude oil supply back to legitimate markets, helping to ease a slight portion of supply concerns.

While the proposition remains in the air for the time being, we're also just a few weeks away from the traditional start of the spring surge in gasoline prices, brought on by the change to summer gasoline, seasonal maintenance at refineries and rising demand.

The weeks ahead could be rather ugly with rising prices, especially if Russia pursues a strong-arm invasion of Ukraine."

AAA said on Thursday that "elevated" crude oil prices are continuing to push gas prices higher.

"Although crude prices slipped today due to increased market expectations that more oil could enter the global market if the U.S. and Iran complete a new nuclear agreement, and sanctions are lifted, the tension between Russia and Ukraine contributed to rising oil prices earlier in the week.

Russia is a member of OPEC+, and any sanctions based on their actions toward Ukraine may cause it to withhold crude oil from the global market," according to AAA.
