The Weather



The high yesterday 67° This morning's low 39°

Today: Sunny, with a high near 73°. The south wind that comes today will be from 5-15 mph with some 20 mph gusts.

Tonight: Increasing clouds, with a low around 56° and south wind 10-15 mph and gusting to 20.

Thursday: It will be a just partly cloudy at first, then becoming sunny and the high will soar to about 80° . The SW wind will be 15-20 mph and shift to north in the afternoon with gusts to 25 mph. Overnight, expect the temperature to drop to about 36° and the NE wind will blow hard – 10-15 mph and gust to 25. Yes, a cold front has passed through!

The Rest of the Week: By Friday morning the north wind will have slowed to 5-10 mph and the front will move on out with the south breeze returning and the temperature rising into the low to mid 60s.

The weekend will be pretty decent on Saturday, up to the afternoon, when another front will come in and a hard north wind will bring chilling temperatures down to 36° overnight.

Sunday, the north winds get lighter and the breeze will shift back to southerly in the afternoon. The high should be about 63° .

Visit with the City Manager

Lampasas City Manger Finley de Graffenried was in Lampasas Radio studios this morning for his weekly visit with Ronnie Witcher.

The conversation of course immediately went to the aftereffects of the winter weather of last week. They spoke about the power grid, and the way the power is disseminated to the various cities and grids. (The cities of Burnet and Llano never lost power.) The water issues came about when the Bartlett Electric Co-op had rolling blackouts affecting the 195 Central Texas Water Supply pump station, which moves water through Kempner to Lampasas. Mr. de Graffenried also stated that about permits for plumbing repairs due to pipe ruptures will not be charged permit fees.

Property owners are also encouraged to contact the City to take advantage of the Leak Forgiveness Program based on the estimated volume of water lost during a break. Most public park restrooms are out of service until repairs or replacements can take place. This include the 580 sports complex, Turner Park, WM Brook Park, and Campbell park. The city also posted that they responded to 44 calls for cut off due to water pipes bursting.

The city election to take place on May 1st shows 2 contested races. The mayoral race will be Myles Haider running for the office as well as TJ Monroe. Place 1 candidates are Zak Morris and Clayton Tucker.
