## The Weather

The High yesterday 70°

The Low this morning 42°

A cool front will move southward through our region today, but with light northerly breezes and cool conditions already here, it won't be very noticeable. The winds speeds should increase early this afternoon as the front moves through.

A stronger push of colder air will arrive tonight. Wind speeds will increase to 20-30mph near midnight and temperatures will fall into the low 30's, bringing wind chills in the 20's tomorrow morning.

**Today:** The skies will be sunny with a high near 59° and the high temperature should be 59°. Winds will be N-NW near 15 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

**Tonight:** The low temperature should be near 35°. The wind will be N-NW increasing to 15-20 mph after midnight. Wind could gust as high as 25 mph.

**Wednesday:** Sunny with a high temperature near 49°. Wind will be N-NW at 15-20 mph with possible gusts of 30 mph.

**Wednesday Night:** Clear skies and a low near 28°. The wind will be N-NW at 10-15 mph calming in the evening.

**Thursday:** Sunny with a high near 61°. Wind will be S-S-SW at 5-10 mph.

**Thursday Night:** Clear with S-SW wind at 5 mph becoming W after midnight. The low will be near 35°.

## District Court Notes

Lampasas Courthouse was the site of a 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Docket Call on February 21<sup>st</sup>.

Presiding over the court was 27<sup>th</sup> District Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 19 cases were brought before the court. 11 of them involved men, and 8 involved women. Joshua Sanchez failed to appear and a warrant was issued for his arrest.

There were 8 cases involving possession of a controlled substance. 3 for less than a gram, 4 for 1-4 grams and 1 for manufacture and delivery/possession 4-200 grams. There were 2 DWI cases. There was one felony case for theft of a firearm, one for evading, one for tampering with evidence and 2 for credit/debit card abuse.

There was one felony criminal mischief case and one for having a prohibited substance in a correctional facility. There were 2 cases for injury to a child/elderly.

Of the 19 cases presented to the court, 4 were settled. Lee Myers received 4 years probation plus fines and costs for possession of a controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams. Ruben Gutierrez, on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram, received 3 years probation, plus costs and fines. Also on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram, Victoria McDonald of Eddy, Texas received 5 years probation plus costs and fines. Valerie Wood pled guilty to having a prohibited substance in a correctional facility, and was sentenced to 4 years in TDCJ with credit for days served.

The balance of the cases were reset or had trials set for a future date.

information, the National Weather Service (NWS) established SKYWARN® with partner organizations. SKYWARN® is a citizen volunteer program with between 350,000 and 400,000 trained severe weather spotters. SKYWARN® storm spotters are citizens who form the nation's first line of defense against severe weather. These volunteers help keep their local communities safe by providing timely and accurate reports of severe weather to the National Weather Service.

Although SKYWARN® spotters provide essential information for all types of weather hazards, the main responsibility of a SKYWARN® spotter is to identify and describe severe local storms. In an average year, the United States experiences more than 10,000 severe thunderstorms, 5,000 floods and more than 1,000 tornadoes.

Since the program started in the 1970s, the information provided by SKYWARN® spotters, coupled with Doppler radar technology, improved satellite and other data, has enabled NWS to issue more timely and accurate warnings for tornadoes, severe thunderstorms and flash floods. Storm spotters play a critical role because they can see things that radar and other technological tools cannot, and this ground truth is critical in helping the NWS perform our primary mission, to save lives and property. The SKYWARN presentation covers severe thunderstorm characteristics, cloud formations, identifying the different threats associated with severe storms, how to report, and basic weather safe

The SkyWarn class for Lampasas County will be next Wednesday, March 4<sup>th</sup> at the County Annex building from 6-8pm. The NWS does not require registration.
