The Weather

Today: Patchy heavy fog early, then mostly cloudy with a high near 67° and E-SE wind around 5 mph.

Tonight: Patchy fog after 9pm, otherwise very cloudy and down to about 55°. The E-SE wind will be near calm.

Wednesday: Another foggy morning, otherwise cloudy to mid day, then the sun pops out for a nice afternoon, up to 77° with S-SW wind 5 mph. Overnight a small chance of rain as the east wind shifts to north after midnight.

The rest of the week: Thursday should be much cooler with the arrival of the cool front. The high will be about 60° with N-NW wind. The changing winds will shift to southerly for Friday with a mid-70s afternoon. That will change again Friday night with another cold front behind a wind that shifts back to northerly. The high Saturday will be in the upper 50s with a 20% chance of rain. That increases to 30% overnight and Sunday, along with a 20% chance of rain, will only get up to about 50° at best.

Commissioners Meet

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court met Monday morning in the courthouse and worked their way through a light agenda.

They approved the County's payroll, payroll taxes, and billing for the period ending on the 18th of February. Payroll was \$113,120.48 and payroll taxes were \$38,438.10.

Though It was not an item requiring action, the Court Acknowledged that Veterans Service Officer Matthew Reed has completed his required annual training. The Veterans Service Officer is a County employee who serves as an advocate for Texas veterans.

Also, in another non-actionable item, the Court acknowledged the annexation by the City of 4.08 acres of land out of the James Easley Survey. The tract has been developed as Putters & Gutters. Actions taken by the Court included:

- •approving a Request for Bid for gas and diesel at the station. A notice for the request will be posted March 12th; bids will be opened at 10 am March 27th, and the contract will be awarded April 18th.
- •appointing an EMS Subcommittee to review the 911 Ambulance Service Agreement. The current agreement with Acadian will expire September 30th. Appointed were Commissioners Mark

Rainwater & Bobby Carroll, along with Co. Clerk Connie Hartman, and Christopher Brister.

- •approved a request from the Sheriff's Department to apply for a Justice Grant to obtain a mobile evidence recovery unit to assist with major crime scenes and catastrophic incidents. Sheriff Ramos said the grant would not require a match and should not cost the County anything. The grant could be for \$10,000 to \$20,000.
- •approved a new 90 day burn ban with exceptions.

City Council Meets – Recognizes Lady Badgers Basketball

First up for Lampasas City Council's Regular session last night was to recognize the successful Lampasas Lady Badgers Basketball team.



Mayor Misti Talbert spoke of their 29-7 season that came within 2 points of an area championship. The entire team was on hand

to receive individual certificates of recognition.

In conjunction with the team recognition, the Council presented a Community Champions award to Coach Mark Myers and daughter Falyn for their encouragement of girl's athletics, from grades 4 on up via the LB Chaos basketball program.



In the Boards and Department Reports portion of the meeting, the Council received the City Secretary Monthly Report, which detailed an impressive list of tasks and services performed by that department.

- •approving the purchase of 230 remote readable water meters from Core & Main for \$47,610.00. \$50K had already been allocated in the City budget and 214 meters from a previous purchase had been installed:
- •approved the Relay for Life Bark Event set to take place at Hanna Springs Sculpture Garden on March 31st;
- •approved Eckermann Engineering for services for the 2019 Community Development Block Grant Program. HUD and the
