County Commissioners Meeting

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court met Monday morning for a regularly scheduled meeting.

A resolution supporting HB 1613 and SB 748 (State Economic Reimbursement Veterans Exemption act [SERVE]) was approved unanimously after thorough discussion. The bill will help communities disproportionately affected by the ad valorem tax exemption for disabled veterans. Lampasas County is the 3rd worst affected county behind Coryell and Bell County and will obtain approximately 90% reimbursement for damages. "This is a big deal guys," County Judge Randy Hoyer said. "It's going to help tremendously."

The Municipal Utility district was discussed briefly. The district will be similar to a home owner's association as it can collect an 'overlay' tax, can finance and build roads, and has the power to perform eminent domain and issue municipal bonds. A public hearing for more discussion over the Municipal Utility district will be held in April. An opioid settlement between Allergen, CVS, Walmart, and Walgreens was approved.

Lampasas City Council Notes

The Lampasas City Council met Monday evening for regularly scheduled meetings.

The Hostess House Rehabilitation Project was discussed briefly. Although it has been open in its current condition, renovations to the elevator and plumbing are needed. The topic was tabled for further discussion. The 3 year projection of the street improvement forecast shows steps to improve data collection methods over the last year, such as implementing a PASER Rating System for all streets and continuously reassessing the pavement condition throughout the year. These efforts will give staff on the street department a broad look at street conditions and where monies should be focused for pavement preservation and rehabilitation. A second reading of an ordinance calling the May 6th, 2023 general election for the city of Lampasas to elect the expired terms of the mayor and council members places one, two, and six was approved unanimously. The fire department report shows 6 fires, 102 rescue & EMS, 3 hazardous condition calls, 4 service calls, and 17 good intent calls. The city has posted full-time job vacancies for Park Maintenance Tech; Apprentice Line Worker; Line Worker; Golf Course Greens-keeper; Police Officer or Police Cadet.

The city manager's report was discussed. A preliminary application on behalf of the City to TxDOT for transportation alternative funding has been submitted. The application has been selected for further consideration and staff has been invited to review the project and process at the district office in Brownwood. AdventHealth Rollins Brook received recognition for their Leapfrog Top Rural Hospital listing. Hospitals earning that designation have better systems and safety measures in place to prevent medication errors, achieve higher quality metrics and have lower infection rates.

Council then went into executive session to discuss the appointment, employment, evaluation, reassignment, and duties of city manager.

City Brush Chipping Program to Begin

The City of Lampasas will begin a brush clipping program in March. There will be no charge for brush drop off at the collection station for the month of March.

The following rules apply to brush pick-up: The brush is no longer than 4 feet in length. No lumber or trash will be picked up. The bundle must be out by the curb, no alley pick up.

March 6-March 10 will have pickup in the northwest section of the city, west of Key Ave. and north of 1st St. March 12-March 17 will have pickup in the southwest section of the city, west of Key Ave. and south of 1st St. March 20-March 24 will see pickup in the southeast section of the city, east of Key Ave. and south of 1st St. March 27-March 31 will see pickup in the northeast section of the city, east of Key Ave. and north of 1st St.

Note: City sponsored brush chipping will occur only during designated weeks and designated areas.

Elevated Fire Danger

Since Friday, Texas A&M Forest Service has responded to 8 wildfires for 5,801 acres burned across the state. A warm and dry fire environment will support wildfire activity for much of the state this week.

Dry vegetation across the western half of the state may support increased activity in dry, dormant grasses through Wednesday. Areas with dry vegetation south and west of Amarillo and Wichita Falls down to Del Rio will see an increase in activity when exposed to periods of elevated localized fire weather.

A potent storm system and cold front is forecast to move into Texas on Thursday bringing elevated fire weather to areas south of Lubbock to Abilene and into South Texas. Dry, dormant grasses, record high temperatures and increased wind speeds may support wildfire activity in these areas.
