The Weather

The forecasters expect the temperature to warm to or exceed 80°, and will remain humid with the southerly winds. Minor changes in the weather pattern will allow for rain at times this week with temperatures in the normal range or a little above.

Meetings Today

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court met this morning at 9am at the Lampasas County Courthouse. The agenda included a grant application for Lampasas County Volunteer Fire



Dept. Radio Project, Awarding bids for asphalt and emulsion, and professional lawn care & grounds maintenance. There will be a request bid for Non Spec/Spec Flex Base, and asphalt reclaimer. Racial profiling reports from area law enforcement agencies, a traffic survey for CR 2315 and CR 2337 for a speed limit decrease, and discussion about closing a portion of CR 1716. Central Texas Council of Governments will discuss some 911 addressing and there will be discussion of appointment of director to the board of the Central Texas Housing Finance Corp.

At 10:30am there was an informational meeting on the progress of construction of the new law enforcement center. This was NOT an official called meeting, therefore no county business will be conducted.

At 1:30pm there will be a called meeting in the Annex conference room to discuss a department head.

The Lampasas City Council will meet in a workshop session Monday at 5:30pm for discussion and updates regarding the 2020 City Council Work Plan, Cooper Spring Trail Grant, and the Chamber of Commerce 1st quarter report.

In the regular session there will be public hearings, one regarding 208 E. 5th St., one regarding Portable Building Sales in an area zoned commercial at 1573 Barnes St, and one concerning the rezoning of what is known as 707 S. Pecan St. The public hearings will include the rezoning of the tracts from Light Industrial to Multi-family residential (apartments).

Then the city will receive comments regarding amendments to the text of the City Zoning Regulations: to accommodate the 707 S. Pecan building.

After the public hearings, the agenda will include routine matters,

the approval of the HOT funds in the amount of \$3,548.74 for the Chamber BBQ cook off April 3rd & 4th. and cost share opportunities regarding the Cooper Spring Trail Grant. Then there will be the 1st reading of the ordinances regarding 208 E. 5th St., 1573 Barnes St., the rezoning of 707 S. Pecan, and the amendments to the city Zoning Regulations. The City Manager will request qualifications for a licensed attorney for City Prosecutor, and there will be the 2nd reading of the resolution regarding the Life Safety Grant Program. Lastly, a request to close Western St. at E. 3rd to E. 4th St. on March 19th from 10am to 12:30pm for the Boot Mural Unveiling.

Heart Screening for Lampasas Students



With the health and safety of Lampasas

ISD students a top priority, LISD and the Cody Stephens Foundation are excited about the opportunity to provide ECG's to our students in athletics, band, dance and cheer.

One in 300 youths have an undetected heart condition that puts them at risk for Sudden Cardiac Arrest. The ECG has been shown to have not only better accuracy, to be the most effective tool to screen for heart defects.

Lampasas ISD is offering these screenings Wednesday during school hours. Last year a grant was available to cover the cost. This year the cost is \$20 per student. However, Ms. Kuklies, Director of School Health for Lampasas ISD says there are options if the cost is an issue. Students should talk to their coaches or directors if this is the case.

Permission slips are available from coaches, athletic trainers, and campus nurses, can be turned in to them as well.

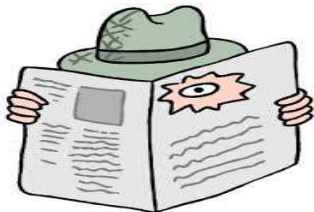
