District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on March 4th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 23 cases were brought to the court with 19 cases involving men, and 4 cases involving women.

Joshua Dupree of Conrad Montana, on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram, failed to appear. Also Keantae Jackson was FTA also on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG 1 less than a gram.

There were 8 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 7 cases for less than a gram, with one being in a drug free zone, and one case for 4-200 grams. There was one case for possession of a controlled substance, PG 2 less than a gram.

There was one case each for engaging in organized criminal activity, theft of service, burglary of a habitation, and theft of a firearm. There were 2 cases for theft of property.

In cases causing personal harm there was 1 case of assault of a family/household member. There was one case each for abandon/endanger child/criminal negligence, accident involving injury, indecency with a child/exposure, failing to comply with registering as a sex offender, and invasive visual recording. There were 2 cases of indecency with a child/sexual contact.

All cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.
