The Weather



The High yesterday 69° The Low this morning 52°

The dense fog is burning off, but is being monitored in case the advisory needs to be extended. Due to the incoming warm air with the southerly winds, the lows tonight should be in the 60's.

Today: The skies will be mostly cloudy with a high near 78°. Winds will become S-SE at 5-10 in the afternoon.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy, and the low temperature should be near 62°. The wind will be S-SW at 5-10 mph.

Wednesday: Partly sunny with a high temperature near 84°. Wind will be S-SW at 5-10 mph.

Wednesday Night: Mostly cloudy skies and a low near 63°. The wind will be S at 5 mph.

Thursday: Mostly cloudy with a high near 83°. Wind will be SW at 5-10 mph. There is a 20% chance of showers.

Thursday Night: Cloudy with a 40% chance of showers and storms. Winds will become calm in the evening and a low near 59°.

District Court Notes



The Lampasas Courthouse was the site of a 27th district court docket Call on March 6th. Presiding over the Court was 27th district Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 29 cases were brought to the court. 21 of them involved men and 8 involved women. Gary Lee Domhoff of Lampasas failed to appear on a charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram. Brittany Fox of Pflugerville failed to appear on the charge of abandon/endanger child. Warrants were issued for these 2 defendants.

There were 9 cases involving possession of a controlled substance, 4 for under 1 gram, 3 for 1-4 grams, and 2 for 4-200 grams. There were 3 DWI cases, two for 3rd or more DWI's and one for DWI w/ a child under 15 in the vehicle. There was one case for felony debit/credit card abuse. There was one case for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, and one for evading arrest with a vehicle. There was one case of tampering/impairing evidence, one for harassing a public servant, one for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon and one cruelty to animal case.

There was one case for injury to the elderly/child. Sex crimes included one each for possession of child pornography, online solicitation of a minor, failing to register as a sex offender, and one for forcing sexual performance. There were 2 cases each for indecency with a child/sexual contact, and aggravated sexual assault of a child.

Bond was found insufficient for Jenifer Hickam on a possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram charge. Bond was also found insufficient for John Hawkins of Temple for failing to register as a sex offender w/previous conviction.

Of the 29 cases presented to the court, 6 of them were settled with Jimmy Lee Wesson of Lampasas, on a charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 4-200 grams, was sentenced to 5 years probation plus costs and fines. William Thompson of Copperas Cove pled guilty to DWI 3rd or more and was sentenced to 5 years probation plus costs and fines. Noel Guerrero, of Killeen pled guilty to unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon and was sentenced to 3 years probation plus court costs. Koal Rainwater of Lampasas pled guilty to DWI w/ a child under 15 in the car and tampering w/ evidence, and saw his probation continued as well as being required to attend a SAFPF program. Jason Scott, of Kempner, on a charge of indecency with a child/sexual contact was sentenced to 4 years in TDCJ w/credit for day served plus court costs. The balance of the cases were reset or had trials set for some future date.

Commissioner's Court Notes

The Lampasas county commissioners held a regular meeting Monday morning at 9am at the Lampasas County Courthouse. The agenda included the consent agenda, which was approved with additions for Atmos gas company bills totaling \$465.56. A resolution for a grant application for the Lampasas County Volunteer Fire Department for a Radio project was approved. The total cost of this would be \$99,597.72. The Commissioners do not expect to receive the full amount. Normally they receive \$300,000 to share between seven counties.

It was approved to accept bids from Wright Asphalt and Ergon Asphalt & Emulsion for the asphalt and emulsion for 2020. County Commissioners received three bids for the lawn care and grounds maintenance bid request. One for \$33,166 from Greenkeepers, another for \$57,720 from JD's one stop shop, and another for \$27,456 from Yards by Jared. This will be for maintenance of the new jail, the annex building, the County Courthouse and the old jail. The bid has went to Yards by Jared for \$27,456. They will be doing maintenance and mowing 26 times a year.

It was approved to reduce the speed limit to 35 mph on both County Road 2315 and County Road 2337. The traffic survey was conducted and it was decided that it would be best to lower the speed limit. A resolution was approved for a grant from Homeland security in the amount of \$40,000 to help get equipment like a bomb detector, GPS tracking devices, and spike strips.

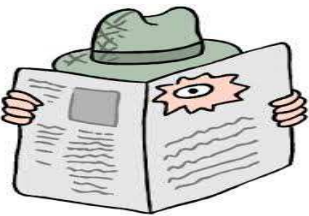
