The Weather



The high yesterday 62° This morning's low 66°

Today: Cloudy, with a high near 78°, and maybe a few degrees warmer, due to the expected sunshine. The winds will be S at 15-20 mph gusting to 30 mph.

Tonight: Look for mostly cloudy skies and a low near 63°. Winds will continue from the S at 15-20 mph gusting to 30 mph.

Thursday: Mostly cloudy with a high near 80°. Wind will be S near 15 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Lampasas City Manger

Lampasas City Manger Finley de Graffenried was in the Lampasas Radio studios this morning for his weekly visit with Ronnie Witcher.

The first item brought up in the interview was the disparity in the rolling blackouts with regard to the areas of town that were hit the worst, which was the SE part of town. Mr. de Graffenried explained that the loads to hospitals were not interrupted, as instructed. He explained that Llano, which only has 1 substation, had not power blackouts. At this time, it is being looked into to have more individual feeds off the transformers, creating a more equal system if it is ever needed again. As far as billing, while the City of Lampasas released a statement toward the end of the cold spell stating they would not raise electric rates to customers, the city, as well as most retailers are dealing with spikes in other types of charges. Some were financially hit harder than others. There will be temporary spikes in other types of charges, but the charge per kilowatt hour stays the same. The City Manager reiterated that the market is going to change. Extra cost will have to be dealt with to make the electric grid more secure, have better preparedness, and be able to handle the colder temperatures. It was asked if it was worth it to spend the money to prepare for temperatures that only seem to happen every 70-80 years?

Mr. de Graffenried pointed out that Texas has unprecedented growth. According to the City Manager, LCRA explained that Texas needs to have enough power base generation to handle these temperatures, and it needs to be non-renewable. Renewable forms of power failed during the cold spell. Also, notable, LCRA's hydroelectric plants were up and generating at 80% over the course of the freezing days, and thermal plants were at 57%.

The City of Lampasas is hosting a Town Hall Meeting on Monday, March 22nd at the old middle school cafeteria, to receive citizen input.

Dr. Georgia Hay shared with Lampasas Radio this morning that Lampasas was at 5 active cases, 2064 total cases, and one more fatality, a woman in her 80's. for a total of 29 fatalities. The State of Texas saw 3,744 new confirmed cases yesterday, and 1,063 probable cases. 4,702 Texans are hospitalized with Covid-19

SOS Vaccine Initiative Now Includes Lampasas County

Governor Greg Abbott yesterday announced that the Texas Division of Emergency (TDEM), the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS), and the Texas Military Department (TMD) have announced 34 counties participating in the second week of the Save Our Seniors COVID-19 vaccine initiative. The state has allocated over 10,000 vaccine doses for the second week of the program, which the state will use in partnership with local officials and service organizations to target Texans who are 75 years and older or homebound. TDEM and TMD will work alongside local jurisdictions to set up a central drive-through vaccine clinic in the community or administer directly to homebound seniors — these decisions will be driven by local officials as they identify vulnerable residents in their communities to participate in this program.

Counties participating in the second round of the program are Aransas, Bandera, Bowie, Brooks, Caldwell, Callahan, Coke, Coleman, Dallas, Duval, Henderson, Hockley, Lampasas, Leon, Liberty, Mason, Mitchell, Presidio, Rusk, Sabine, San Patricio, Stephens, Sutton, Titus, Trinity, Val Verde, Van Zandt, Walker, Waller, Webb, Wharton, Willacy, Wilson, Wood.

In coordination with local and state partners, counties and cities have been selected based on recent data provided from DSHS related to the following factors: the number of approved providers in the area, allocations over the past 12 weeks, and least vaccinated counties for 65+ and 75+ administered doses.

The Burn Ban has been lifted until May 7th, however the Texas A & M Forestry Service sent the following to Lampasas Radio, and we confirmed Lampasas County is included in this statement; "Wildfire potential is increased Tuesday through Thursday across portions of the state, including the Western Plains and Trans Pecos. The combination of above normal temperatures and dry conditions, as well as an extended period of forecasted elevated to critical fire weather, will create an environment conducive to wildfire activity this week.. The peak day for increased wildfire potential is likely Wednesday due to above normal temperatures, high wind speeds and low relative humidity over dry fuel beds. Any wildfire that ignites in dormant, cured grasses may spread rapidly due to the expected high wind speeds with gusts near 40-50 mph. These wildfires may be more resistant to firefighters' suppression efforts. In preparation for elevated fire weather conditions, Texas A&M Forest Service has prepositioned additional fire resources across the areas of concern. Additionally, three Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) strike teams have been mobilized to assist
