The Weather



The High yesterday 76° The Low this morning 63°

Today had a mild start with lows only in the mid 60's. This is within 2-3 degrees of our average high temperature for this time of year. The clouds are expected to burn off this morning, and with the sunshine, look for high temperatures to warm into the low 80's.

It looks like an unsettled weather pattern next week with multiple chances of showers and storms.

Today: Cloudy, with gradual clearing and a high temperature near 82°. Wind will be SW at 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy skies with a low near 63°. The wind will be S at 5-10 mph.

Thursday: Partly sunny with a high near 85°. Wind will be S-SW at 10-15 mph, with gusts as high as 20 mph. There is a 20% chance of showers and storms in the afternoon.

Thursday Night: A low near 61° and mostly cloudy skies. Wind will be S at 5-10 mph. There is a 30% chance of showers early in the morning.

Friday: Cloudy with a high temperature near 74°. Wind will become east at 5-10 mph in the afternoon. There is a 40% chance of showers and storms.

Friday Night: Cloudy with a low near 62° and S-SE wind at 10 mph. There is a 50% chance of showers and storms.

Judge Hoyer, at the County Commissioners meeting, brought up how important the Census is to the county. Residents should keep a lookout in their mailbox between March 12 and March 20 every household will receive a packet for the 2020 Census. Residents can go online for certain days to complete the Census Questionnaire. If you do not complete the online version, you will receive a paper questionnaire in the mail and you can complete this for the 2020 census. If you do not complete one of these, then someone will probably show up knocking at your door.

Judge Hoyer emphasized how important the Census is as it dictates a lot of funding and grants that are population based. Many Federal and State Grants are funded base on the population of the County.

The Census is also key to our legislative representation, involving but not limited to redistricting.

Judge Hoyer encourages all residents to complete the information in a timely manner.

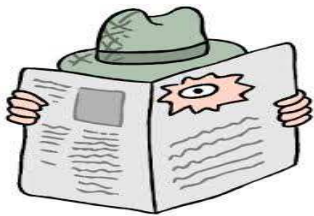
