Commissioners' Court

The Lampasas County Commissioners' Court will have a called meeting this Friday to discuss/consider and take possible action on the 100% Disabled Vets Homestead Property Tax Exemption. Last year, on February 24th at a Lampasas County Commissioners Court meeting, Judge Hoyer led a discussion regarding the 100% disabled veteran's property tax exemption.. Judge Hoyer stated that "Lampasas County does not oppose this exemption in fact we embrace it and we recognize the veterans that have earned it and deserve it and we want to maintain it and keep it. This exemption is without a doubt by far one of the largest unfunded state mandates that we have ever seen and it is costing the county a significant amount of money because we have so many qualified veterans living in our county."

The exemption started in 2009, when a constitutional amendment was voted on in Texas allowing the 100% exemption for qualifying disabled veterans. In 2015 the State Legislature recognized the financial impact that this exemption was having on Texas counties. In 2015 a new legislation was passed granting reimbursement for counties and municipalities that were negatively affected. A caveat in the reimbursement exemption, however, requires that in order to be eligible the county had to have a military installation located in the city or county.

Lampasas county is 1.7 miles away from being eligible for the reimbursement." It is our understanding that the 1.7 miles is the distance from the county line to the closest military installation. State Representative Brad Buckley is scheduled to attend this meeting, and explain the funding issues.

Judge Hoyer believes that if you qualify for this reimbursement, distance should not be an issue, as this is a statewide amendment.

The Lampasas County Commissioners also have a workshop session scheduled next Monday at 10 am in the Conference room at the county annex to discuss Lampasas County Subdivision Regulations.
