The Weather



The High yesterday 77° The Low this morning 57°

Today: Mostly cloudy, a slight chance of a shower before 1pm, the high will be up to 72° this afternoon and the wind will be a bit gusty at 10-15 mph and puffing to 25.

Tonight: Cloudy skies and down to about 59° overnight with south wind 10-15 and gusting.

Sunday: Clouds again, then gradually sunny in the afternoon with a temperature of about 80°. The S-SW wind will be 10-15 mph with gusts to 20. Overnight it will be down to about 59° and there is a slight rain chance in the early morning hours. The south wind will be light.

Next week: Mostly sunny on Monday and up to 74° but there will be a one day cool front with the wind turning northerly at 10 mph or so with possible gusts.

Tuesday will bring sunshine and another mid-70s afternoon with the wind back to the east and Wednesday should be a little warmer, but also a good deal more wind will come in the afternoon, getting up to 25 mph. All in all it will be nice until at least Friday.

27th District Court Notes



Lampasas Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Call on March 22nd with visiting Judge Daniel Mills presiding.

Altogether 15 cases were brought to the court. 10 of them involved men and 5 were women. Joel Meadows failed to appear on a charge of DWI with felony repetition and a warrant was issued.

There were 9 cases involving possession of a controlled substance PG1, with 4 of those cases involving less than a gram and 5 of

them involving 1-4 grams. Jordan Miller was in court on a charge of Possession or transport of a chemical with intent to manufacture a controlled substance, and he saw the case reset for April 5th.

There was one case for theft over \$1500 and under \$20,000, and one for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle.

Adrian Navarro of Lampasas, on a charge of Aggravated Sexual Assault of a Child, has a jury trial set for July 22nd, and on the same charge Elvis Smith of Milan saw his court date reset.

Of the 15 cases presented to the court 1 of them was settled with Alexis Smith of Buchanan Dam sentenced to 3 years deferred adjudicated probation plus a \$750 fine and fees and costs.

The balance of the cases have been reset.

Next Week

Lampasas County Commissioners will meet on Monday morning at 9am in the courthouse. One the agenda are proposed Non-consent Towing Rules & Regulations.

There is also a resolution having to do with HB634. The bill relates to local governments disproportionately affected by the state's granting of ad valorem tax relief to disabled veterans. There's also to be some discussion on county records preservation.

Lampasas County Democratic Party meets at 5:15pm at the courthouse annex, room 101 at 409 S. Pecan St. For more info see lampasasdemocrats.org, or 512-632-1526.

Lampasas City Council will meet on Monday for workshop at 5:30pm and a regular session at 7. The workshop will discuss the upcoming Atlas 4000 Bicycle Ride, interviews with selected firms that vie for the job of preparing a comprehensive plan for the City of Lampasas, and the Stone Valley Development Agreement will get some time.

In the regular session, they'll have proclamations on Johnny "Lam" Jones, Library Week and National Fair Housing Month, then the more "meaty" matters may include reports from the City Manager, \$7,254 to the Chamber of Commerce for event expenses for the Annual Riata Roundup Rodeo and a change order of \$3,600 for putting a logo on the Nix Water Tank.

The Blotter

He went 6 full innings with a 110 pitch count, giving up 3 hits and 3 runs, striking out 10 and walking 3. Whitehead seems to be the consistently satisfying starter with control and lots of pitches. To make it so much better, when Whitehead had to leave the mound, it was Marty Ybarra coming in for the save. Ybarra did what he does best, throw hard and fast. It was three up and three down, a perfect save. When we asked Ace Whitehead after the game about Ybarra's trip the mound, he grinned big and said, "When I saw that first batter go down, I knew it was all over." It was just one inning, but it was perfect.

Another huge night for Badger batters: Leadoff man Ace whitehead was in there with a two bagger and an RBI, leading into Logan Coleman who came up with a hit that started a rally in the 3rd inning when Gauge Gholson got on behind him and then cleanup man Ethan Rascoe sent one over the fence to bring them in. Other hits came from Jon Davis (2), Gage Gholson (2) and Hunter Rebando.
