The Weather



The High yesterday 79° The Low this morning 62°

Today: Mostly cloudy to noon, then starting to clear and the high likely gets up to 75° with west wind of 5-15 mph that will turn to N-NE in the afternoon.

Tonight: Mostly clear, with a low around 44° and N-NE wind of 5-10 mph..

Tuesday: Sunny, with a high near 72° and E-NE wind of 5-10 mph. Overnight, the sky will be clear and it will be cool at 45° by morning. The wind will shift back to east, signaling the end of the weak "norther."

Rest of the week: Wednesday will be sunny and up to 73° with S-SE wind of 5-15 mph and gusting. Thursday and Friday will be nice with temperatures in the mid-70s and lots of clouds that will keep the heat in like a blanket. The wind will be generally brisk and will be southerly.

A change will come on Saturday. The clouds will develop enough that they could bring rain. It appears there is a 30% chance of some moisture and the temperature will hover in the 60s most of the day, topping out at 67°. The long range forecast calls for another 50s-60s day with hopefully a little sunshine.

Reminder-Business Owners This is the week to prepare and submit your Property Tax Renditions!

April 1 is the deadline to file property tax renditions with your county appraisal district if you have a business and are taxed on personal property such as furniture, equipment, fixtures and inventory. It is a list of the number and value of those items as of Jan. 1st, 2019.

The appraisal district may use the information to set property values. The rendition allows property owners to record their opinion of their property's value and ensures that the appraisal district notifies property owners before changing a recorded value. Exempt property, such as church property and equipment used for farming, isn't subject to rendition.

What's Happenin' This Week

Lampasas County Commissioners met this morning at 9am in the courthouse. On the agenda were proposed Non-consent Towing Rules & Regulations.

There is also a resolution having to do with HB634. The bill relates to local governments disproportionately affected by the state's granting of ad valorem tax relief to disabled veterans and, there will be some discussion on county records preservation.

Lampasas County Democratic Party meets at 5:15pm this afternoon at the courthouse annex, room 101 at 409 S. Pecan St. For more info see lampasasdemocrats.org. or 512-632-1526.

Lampasas City Council will meet today for workshop at 5:30pm and a regular session at 7. The workshop will discuss the upcoming Atlas 4000 Bicycle Ride, interviews with selected firms that vie for the job of preparing a comprehensive plan for the City of

Lampasas, and the Stone Valley Development Agreement will get some time.

In the regular session, they'll have proclamations on Johnny "Lam" Jones, Library Week and National Fair Housing Month, then the more "meaty" matters may include reports from the City Manager, \$7,254 to the Chamber of Commerce for event expenses for the Annual Riata Roundup Rodeo and a change order of \$3,600 for putting a logo on the Nix Water Tank.

They'll also go over matters on the Stove Valley Development Agreement and discuss a City Sign Presentation. The LEDC will have a recommendation from the Foresite Group related to developing additional broadband capacity here, the Hancock Park Golf Course needs a Door Retrofit on the pump station there, and probably the biggest ticket item for the meeting will come up. That is the selection and cost of a firm to provide comprehensive planning services.

The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Saturday showed a suspicious vehicle report in the 2300 block of FM 580 E at 1:44am and a suspicious person report much later in the 1700 block of CTE at 11:53am.

There was a reckless driver report on Hwy 281S at 1:28pm and another on Hwy 190 at 2:30pm. There was a theft report in the 600 block of N. Ridge at 5pm and harassment reported in the same area a few minutes later.

The evening brought a fraud report in the 1700 block of CTE at 7:39pm and a minor accident in the 300 block of Sunrise Hills at 8:05pm. A major accident took place at Ohnmeiss and CTE at 9:42pm with one person transported to the ER. Yet another accident, this one a minor with no injuries, took place in the 800 block of S. Key at 10:38pm.

Three arrests took place. The first in the 800 block of S. Key when a local 72 yr old man was locked up on a DWI. At 11:48pm a 22 yr old Hutton woman was arrested in the 800 block of N. Key. Ana Maria Menoza was charged with delivery of marijuana over ¼ oz but under 5 lbs and for unlawful carrying of a weapon. In the same incident, Anthony Alan Gallegos, 20 of Hutto, was charged with the same delivery of the marijuana and unlawful carrying of a weapon.

Sunday reports showed a quieter day with the first report of a suspicious person in the 700 block of Old Georgetown Rd. at 3:36am, then a suspicious vehicle report in the 700 block of S. Key at 6:40am.
