

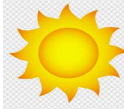

The Weather



The High yesterday 68° The Low this morning 47°

Today: Sunny skies and a high near 80° courtesy of the southerly winds, which will be S at 5-15 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Tonight: Look for increasing clouds, with a low near 58°. Winds will be S-SE at 5-10mph.

Saturday: Cloudy skies in the morning and a 20% chance of showers. Clouds will decrease in the afternoon to bring sunny skies and a high temperature near 80°. Winds will be S-SW near 5-10 mph.

Saturday night: A cold front is expected to move through the area bringing a 20% chance of showers and storms. Otherwise partly cloudy skies with a low around 54°, and winds becoming N at 10-15 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Sunday: Mostly sunny skies with a 30% chance of showers in the morning. Winds will continue from the N at 15-20 mph and possible gusts of 30 mph and the high temperature will be near 68°.

Sunday Overnight: Partly cloudy skies with a low near 44° and wind becoming light from the N-NE in the evening.

Next Week: A dryline is expected to advance through the area Tuesday bringing compressional heating ahead of a cold front Tuesday night.

Covid-19 Vaccines ...

It looks like the vaccines for Covid-19 are becoming more readily available. Cattles Pharmacy is now locally offering the vaccines, you can call and make an appointment. Governor Abbott yesterday announced another program to increase the vaccines among Texas senior citizens. This program will work with AARP and Medicare plans to reach older Texans. This program plans to reach 2 million seniors, and in conjunction with the Save our Seniors initiative, hopes to reach more senior citizens and give them the tools and information they need to receive a vaccine.

The Save our Seniors program has the Texas Dept. of Emergency Management working with the Texas Military to set up drive through clinics and administer directly to homebound seniors. 24,000 seniors have been vaccinated through this program.

Governor Abbott's press release partially reads as follows: "Previously, the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) announced that COVID-19 vaccinations will be open to all Texans beginning March 29th. Additionally, DSHS has directed vaccine providers to prioritize people 80 years old or older when scheduling appointments and accommodate anyone in that age group who presents for vaccination, whether or not they have an appointment, by immediately moving them to the front of the line. That will ensure vaccination of anyone 80 or older with as small a burden on themselves as possible."

Dr. Georgia Hay shared with Lampasas Radio this morning that Lampasas was at 7 active cases, and 2093 total cases. When asked about the Save our Seniors Initiative by Governor Abbott, Dr. Hay shared that they are working on setting up some drive thru clinics for that.

The State of Texas saw 2,167 new confirmed cases yesterday, and 788 probable cases. 3,410 Texans are hospitalized with Covid-19.
