Monday Meeting Notes

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court held a regularly scheduled meeting Monday morning. Brief discussion took place over Lampasas CPS and the county's foster system. 40 children in Lampasas are currently in CPS care; of those 40 and on average within the county, neglect occurred more often than physical and sexual abuse. A proclamation to establish April as Child Abuse Prevention Month was approved unanimously. The purpose of Child Abuse Prevention Month is to educate and provide awareness regarding child abuse and child protective services and to provide possible solutions to affected children. A proposal to purchase a Ford Super Duty F550 for the Lampasas Volunteer Fire Dept. was approved unanimously. The Lampasas County Precinct 1 Constable racial profiling report was accepted and approved unanimously without discussion.

The Lampasas City Council held a regularly scheduled meeting Monday evening. The meeting began with the workshop session to discuss staffing for the pool season. The regular session took place immediately following the workshop session.

The city has received 2 applications for the pool; both are for a cashier position. For the City of Lampasas to operate both pools safely it requires a minimum of 28-32 employees; which includes management, lifeguards, maintenance personnel, and cashiers. The city has found that many retailers starting wages are significantly higher than what the city offers resulting in a staffing shortage.

Surrounding areas, such as Harker Heights with a much larger employee pool, are experiencing the same staffing issues.

A reading of an ordinance for a specific-use permit in an area zoned Retail "R" to allow for a tire shop at 101 S. Key Avenue was approved unanimously. The City Manager's operational report was discussed in full during the meeting: March sales tax receipts marked a continued positive trend for the city. The city was allocated \$219,646 compared to \$203,308 in March 2022, an 8.3% increase.

Tremendous activity and usage of the Campbell Park Skate Park was reported by staff on the Skate Park project. The city, in coordination with stakeholders, will hold a scheduled ribbon cutting at 9am on Saturday, April 15th at the Skate Park.

Resolutions authorizing the submission of the Texas Community Development Block Grant and authorizing city representatives to act in matters pertaining to the Downtown Revitalization Program were approved. A notice for the May 6th General Election was approved unanimously.

There will be a Town Hall Meeting April 5th from 5:30-6:30pm at 107 N. Main in the old middle school cafeteria.

The meeting will cover the planning going into the Solar Eclipse in 2024 for the City of Lampasas.

Changing Fort Hood's Name

Fort Hood will officially be redesignated Fort Cavazos May 9th in honor of a Texas-born hero of the Korean and Vietnam wars, Gen. Richard Edward Cavazos. The ceremony will be held at the III Armored Corps Headquarters here.

Cavazos was born on Jan. 31, 1929, in Kingsville, Texas, to Mexican American parents, Lauro and Thomasa Ouintanilla Cavazos. His father was a World War I veteran who later became a ranch foreman of the King Ranch's Santa Gertrudis division.

In 1951, Cavazos was commissioned into the Army and completed basic officer training at Fort Benning, Georgia. He began his military career deployed to Korea where he was the platoon leader of E Company, 2nd Battalion, 65th Infantry Regiment. In 1953, Cavazos rotated back to the United States and was assigned to Fort Hood. Reaching the rank of lieutenant colonel, Cavazos deployed to Vietnam in 1967 where he commanded the 1st Battalion, 18th Infantry Regiment.

In 1976, Cavazos became the first Hispanic to reach the rank of brigadier general in the U.S. Army. In 1980, now a lieutenant general, Cavazos served as the III Corps Commanding General. In 1982, Cavazos was promoted to become the first Hispanic four-star general and succeeded Gen. Robert Shoemaker as commanding general of U.S. Army Forces Command. Cavazos retired from the Army in 1984 after 33 years of service.

Texas Senate Budget Proposals

Texas could spend billions in new state money under measures Texas Senate budget writers approved Monday.

The Senate Finance Committee set aside an additional \$5 billion over the next two years for teacher pay raises and other educator programs — as well as costs associated with offering parents private school subsidies — a proposal currently spurring heated debate in the Legislature. They also added \$3.7 billion for cost-of-living adjustments for retired teachers and agreed to spend an additional \$650 million on school safety measures.

The senators approved \$500 million for broadband programs and \$1 billion for a Texas "water fund" to help finance future water projects. They also earmarked \$18 million over the next two years for foster care services for children without placements. Both chambers bolstered payments for family members who take in foster kids.

The panel set aside \$1 million to help county election workers get trained in security measures.

Senators also funneled more than half a billion in new money to the Texas Department of Public Safety — including money for some 250 new officers, \$381.5 million to revamp the training facility in Williamson County, and tens of millions for bulletproof windshields, new helicopters and upgraded communications equipment.

Senate budget writers agreed to fund Gov. Greg Abbott's \$150 million disaster relief fund, which he controls — and through which he had been paying for Operation Lone Star.

They proposed funding the governor's victim's assistance program and allotting \$55 million for his film incentive program.
