Today: Look for partly sunny skies and a high temperature near 71° with a 30 chance of showers through early afternoon. E-NE wind at 5-10 mph will shift S-SE this afternoon.

Friday Night: Mostly clear skies and the low will be near 50°. Wind will be W-NW near 5-15 mph with gusts as high as 25 mph.


In Lampasas Radio Studios

This morning Fire Chief Jeff Smith and Lampasas Economic Development Corp. Director Stacey Ybarra joined Ronnie Witcher in Lampasas Radio Studios.

Chief Smith and Ms. Ybarra brought some information for people in town. The City is expecting the population of Lampasas to double or triple for the Eclipse. Other places that have done this have seen from 10,000-50,000 people travel to their town to see the eclipse. There really is no way to measure how many people will be here, but expect congestion on city streets.

Chief Smith is making plans to have good response capability for the fire department and said some roads may be shut down. He also said with that many people, cell service may be questionable, so be prepared.

There will be a town hall meeting on April 5th from 5:30-6:30 in the old Middle School Cafeteria by the Boys & Girls club at 107 N. Main St. At the town hall meeting, Ms. Ybarra will share information about business round-table meetings that she will be having with business owners, to see if they will be open, and how they will handle the influx of customers.



In other business, Chief Smith wanted to remind all city residents that you have to have a burn permit through the City of Lampasas if you want to burn. You do not need a permit if you have a burn barrel. Just be careful!

Ms. Ybarra, when she is not dealing with the eclipse, is busy promoting the Lampasas Business Park and is reaching out to adjoining counties and cities to try and bring industry to the Business Park. She hopes to see a manufacturing business take up residence there.

(cont'd from front) "The grant will help provide wildfire protection to the fastest growing area in the state," said Victoria Wenkman, Texas A&M Forest Service Fuels Program Specialist.

"Historically, fire has been part of the natural process in Texas, however with the rapid increase in population coupled with fragmentation of wildland areas, fire has been taken out of its normal interval pattern. Mechanical fuels reduction provides an alternative, reducing overall wildfire threat."

Funding will be provided to eligible public and private landowners for reimbursement of costs associated with hand-cut fuel breaks using chainsaws or mechanical mulching using mechanical brush cutters, forestry mulchers and similar equipment. Fuel breaks are modified sections of vegetation that can decrease intensity of fires, protect first responders via wider access lanes and inhibit or slow incoming wildfires.


Thirty-two counties in Central Texas including Lampasas County are eligible for funding of costs not to exceed \$750 per acre for hand-cut fuel breaks or \$2,000 per acre for mulched fuel breaks. The maximum reimbursement for either method is \$10,000. Applications are due April 30, 2023.
