## The Weather



**The High yesterday 73° The Low this morning 64°**

The steady winds from the north will keep temperatures below normal today. Tonight will be cool as well before the winds return to the south tomorrow bringing back the moisture and warm temperatures.

**Today:** Look for clearing skies this afternoon. The high temperature will be near 70°. Winds will be N at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

**Tonight:** Mostly clear, and the low temperature should be near 48°. The wind will be N-NE near 5 mph becoming calm.

**Wednesday:** Partly sunny with a high temperature near 75°. Wind will be S-SE at 5-15 mph.

**Wednesday Night:** Mostly cloudy skies and a low near 57°. The wind will be S-SE at 10-15 mph.

**Thursday:** Cloudy with a high near 73° and a 40% chance of showers. Wind will be S at 10-15 mph.

**Thursday Night:** Mostly cloudy with winds from the S-SE at 10-15 mph, and a low near 63°.

## Updated Closures, Cancellations and Changes.....

**Lampasas Radio** has not received any information about the Shelter in Place orders from either the City of Lampasas, Lampasas County or Lampasas ISD.

Meetings are being held to figure out how best to move forward at this time.

**Lampasas High School** has packets from last week available until noon today if you did not pick yours up last week. This week packets can be picked up/dropped off at Lampasas High School on Friday, April 3<sup>rd</sup> from 11am to 6pm. The teachers have virtual office hours from 9-11am, 1-3pm and 6-7pm if students need assistance.

**Lampasas Middle School** had packet-pick-up yesterday, with a tentative return date of April 27th if school is not in session.

**The City of Copperas Cove** has closed all city offices. Services will be available by telephone, email and online only. The only exception is the Police Dept. Lobby which will remain open. The city states that they are working to minimize the impacts on Copperas Cove citizens. Contact information for all services are available on the city's website at [www.copperascovetx.gov](http://www.copperascovetx.gov). Concerns can be addressed by calling Kevin Keller at 254-547-4221.

**The St. Mary's Food Pantry** will be open on Friday April 3<sup>rd</sup> from 1-3pm. Pre-packed bags of food will be given in a drive-through distribution with no-contact. Please come to the St. Mary's parking lot, and a volunteer will instruct you on how to line up to receive the bags of food.

**The Lampasas Economic Development Corporation** will be co-hosting with the Lampasas County Chamber of Commerce a virtual meeting with Representative Brad Buckley. The event will be this Wednesday, April 1<sup>st</sup> from 12pm-1pm.



**The LCHEC office** will be open on Monday, April 6th with a skeleton crew. If you have any questions, this is the time to give us a call. We will not have the office open for person to person visits. Phone calls only. 512-556-8226

## Going Somewhere?

**Not so fast.....**

**The extraordinary** impact of the Coronavirus has affected everyone in some form or fashion.

The travel restrictions now are almost unheard of.

Rhode Island was requiring people entering their state from New York to quarantine for 14 days. They have now expanded their order to include anyone coming from another state for a non-work related purpose.

Governor Abbott has issued extensive executive orders requiring anyone from New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, California, and Washington to undergo 14 days of quarantine. People from the cities of Miami, Atlanta, Detroit and Chicago and anyone driving in from Louisiana must also undergo a mandatory 14 day quarantine. Governor Abbot has DPS assisting with checking to make sure that quarantine is being followed.

The states of Maryland, Delaware, Hawaii, Vermont, West and Virginia have the same 14 day quarantine orders. Kentucky residents must quarantine for 14 days if they leave the state and return. Florida is requiring the quarantine for travelers from New York, New Jersey or Connecticut and has checkpoints on the roads to screen travelers from Louisiana. Oklahoma has ordered travelers from 6 different states to quarantine, and Alaska, Montana and Massachusetts are also requiring the 14 day quarantine for all out of state visitors.

While governors cannot prevent people from entering their states, they are able to implement a 14 day quarantine and enforcing them with the state police.

## Coronavirus Numbers

**According to the Dept. of State Health Services** there are 2,877 cases of COVID-19 in the state and 38 have died. According to the KXAN news in Austin, there are 3,161 cases in Texas and 46 have died.

Locally, Bell County has 36 cases, Williamson County 37 cases, Brown County 3 cases, Llano 3 cases, Burnet 2 cases and Coryell has 1 case.

## Roadwork Ahead



**WACO** – The Texas Department of Transportation (Waco District) will temporarily close the roadway and conduct pavement repair operations on portions of I-14/US 190, south of Copperas Cove, beginning Sunday, April 5, 2020, weather permitting.

This routine maintenance work will repair pavement sections along I-14 from the Business 190 split, east of Copperas Cove, to the intersection of I-14 and FM 3046, southwest of the city.

The work will begin Sunday at 10 p.m. thru 7 a.m. Monday, then continue Monday thru Friday between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. and is expected to last about one week, weather permitting. Work is not currently planned for Saturday. Eastbound and westbound I-14 traffic will detour via Business 190 through Copperas Cove during the overnight hours of the repair operations. The roadway will reopen by 7 a.m. daily.

TxDOT cautions motorists to be alert for traffic control along the detour route and at I-14 access points within the work area.
