The Weather

Today: Cloudy with a high near 63°. Winds will be gusty from the N at 20-25 mph gusting to 30 mph. Fire danger will be elevated. Clouds are expected to clear from the west to the east this afternoon.

Lampasas City Manager

Lampasas City Manager Finley de Graffenried was in the Lampasas Radio studios this morning for his weekly visit with Ronnie Witcher.

They spoke about a study being done to see if a bypass is needed in Lampasas. They are assessing the number of trucks coming through town, creating congestion in the downtown area, and how best to meet that challenge. Mr. de Graffenried also expressed concern to keep traffic down, to provide commerce traffic to the businesses on and near the downtown square.

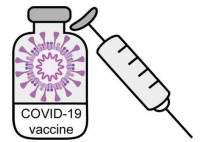
Mr. Witcher brought up the past year, how everything seems at a standstill, with Covid, and the deep freeze (Snowid). He feels the area is rebounding out of the covid shutdowns, and there is optimism about the vaccines and going forward, and the return to normal occupancy in our schools and businesses. The subject of masks were touched on, and if it is a cause for concern. The City Manager asks if you are in someplace, keep the 6 feet of distance suggested, and if you choose, wear a mask to protect yourself.

When asked about the sales tax trends, Mr. de Graffenried shared that year-to-date the city has collected 56% of its projected sales tax revenue. This is in a 6 month fiscal year timeframe.

People are calling about the electric bills during the cold snap. Customers are advised that when there was electric, more was used due to the cold weather. The city has not increased the rates, and charge for use. If you have an issue, residents are advised to call city hall and look into the matter, and make sure all electric appliances are maintained and in good working condition. A final report is being drafted to present to the City Council during the workshop session on April 12th, advising what the city did right and what needs improvement.

The next City Council meeting will also include the 2nd reading of the comprehensive plan, and the 2nd reading of increasing the solid waste rate for city utility customers, and information on the capital improvement program.

A drive-thru Covid-19 vaccination clinic is being held in Kempner at the Kempner Fire Station at 315 S. Pecan, today through April 3rd from 7-10pm, April 4th from 9am-7pm, and Monday and Tuesday, April 5th & 6th, from 10am-3pm.

This clinic is only for phase 1a & 1b residents-50 and older-and is administered by the National Guard. The supplier of the vaccine will not be known until they are picked up by the Guard.

Last summer, most summer camps were shuttered across the country because of the pandemic. The tests will be voluntary for both staff and campers. Summer camp organizers need to apply to participate.

"As normalcy returns to Texas, we must remain vigilant against the spread of COVID-19 by identifying positive cases and mitigating any potential outbreaks," Abbott said in the statement. "I encourage qualifying summer camps to apply for this program so that we can continue to keep Texans safe."

This comes after Texas ended most of its coronavirus-related restrictions earlier this month.

Texas has a series of health recommendations revised this month for summer camp operators, including social distancing rules, prohibiting parent or guardian visits except to pick up or drop off a child and separating campers and staff into smaller cohorts that do not mix for the duration of the camp. Guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says summer camps can reopen safely if they follow a number of protocols. Staff members or campers who test positive should be immediately isolated and then removed from the camp, according to the Texas Department of State Health Services. Parents are told to pick up their children within eight hours if they become infected.

Many parents across Texas rely on summer camps — some which operate daytime hours and not overnight — for child care while school is out for summer break.
