The Weather

High yesterday was 67° Low this morning was 64°

The forecasters say to look for a gusty NW wind and a 15-20 degree cool down within an hour of the front's passage. There are 40's behind the front. The best potential for severe storms will be across the Central Texas area this afternoon with the biggest threats being hail and downburst winds. The threat for severe storms will shift south of the forecast area by Friday night. The rain and storms will continue through the night-time, where some heavy rainfall may result in localized flooding. The National Weather Service says to stay aware in our area, due to the amount of rain expected this weekend.

Today: Look for showers and storms for most of the day with an 80% chance. The high temperature will top our near 68° just before noon, then fall to near 60° for the rest of the day. The wind will become N at 10-15 today gusting to 20 mph.


Tonight: Showers and storms likely, before 8pm. Then **c**loudy with a low near 46°. Winds will be N at 10-15 mph with gusts as high as 20 mph. there is a slight chance of showers early in the morning.

Saturday: A 60% chance of showers and storms. Otherwise cloudy with a high near 59 and N wind at 10 mph.

Saturday night: A 60% chance of showers and storms mainly between 8pm and 2am. Cloudy with a low near 53°, and light N-NE winds becoming calm.

Sunday: Cloudy with a 40% chance of showers and storms. With a high temperature near 70°. Winds will be calm becoming E at 5 mph in the afternoon.

Sunday night: Cloudy with a 50% chance of showers and storms. and a low near 61°, with E-SE winds at 5 mph becoming calm. **Monday:** A 70% chance of showers and storms with a high near 77°. Winds will come around from the S at 5 mph



Keep Doing What We're Doing!

Lampasas County Health Authority, Dr. Georgia Hay (above right) was in the studios at Lampasas Radio this morning. She spoke about the positive Covid-19 case in Lampasas County. This is the first Covid-19 case in our county. It has been confirmed through the Region 7 Public Health. The person is self quarantining and thankfully is not in the hospital. Dr. Hay asks that the public allow the Health Authorities in our county to handle this situation.

Dr. Hay stresses that the county is doing a great job on social distancing! And to keep doing what we are doing.

The anticipated peak for cases in our area is expected to be around the 1st of May. According to the authorities, the longer we can keep up social distancing the better. The more time we have before cases start increasing the more time the local and medical authorities have to obtain supplies as well as knowledge.

The Local Authorities meet several times a week, and keep residents up to date.

Right now, Dr. Hay said tests are limited, but they hope to have more soon. If you have a respiratory issue, please do not arrive at the medical clinic or Emergency Room without calling first. Most medical visits are being handled over the phone at this time, with very limited in-person appointments.

As for the kids getting on your nerves, she had an answer for that, too. Put 'em to work! She insists upon her medical authority it will not hurt them! Make sure the chore is age-appropriate, and let them help out.

"The way to stop this is to stay home" is the mantra, and "Keep Doing What We're Doing".

"City Responds to Confirmed County Case

Today City Officials responded to the first confirmed case of COVID-19 in eastern Lampasas County. "We knew this day would come, and want to remind our residents to continue to be vigilant to limit any possible future exposures," stated Jeff Smith, City of Lampasas Fire Chief. On March 23, 2020, City of Lampasas Mayor Misti Talbert issued a Disaster Declaration that defined essential business and essential activities, and encourages residents to stay at home. "There is no question, the steps that were put in place over 10 days ago, and the actions of our residents and businesses, have made a big difference in delaying the spread of the virus in Lampasas," said Mayor Talbert. "It is a source of great pride seeing our community come together for this fight," added the Mayor. The City continues to reinforce best practices of good personal hygiene, hand washing, physical distancing, and not assembling in groups larger than 10. City Council will meet on April 6, 2020 to discuss an extension to the Declaration through April 30, 2020 consistent with the date on Governor's Essential Services and Activities Executive Order, GA-14.
