The main weather story early this week is the warm temperatures. Look for high temperatures 5-15 degrees above normal. There will be multiple opportunities for showers and storms this week, with a few strong storms possible in our area Wednesday afternoon or evening. A cold front is expected to move through our area on Thursday creating a 15-20 degree temperature drop, and some rain expected.

Today: Mostly cloudy with a high temperature near 86°. Winds will be W-SW at 5-15 mph, gusting to 20 mph.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy with a low temperature near 68°. The wind will be S-SW at 5-10 mph.

Wednesday: Partly sunny with a high temperature near 89° and a 20% chance of showers in the afternoon. Wind will be SW at 5-15 mph.

Wednesday Night: A slight chance of showers and storms in the evening, then mostly cloudy skies and a low near 65°. Winds will be calm.

Thursday: Mostly cloudy with a high near 74° and a 50% chance of showers and storms. Wind will become N-NE at 5-10 mph in the morning.

Thursday Night: Cloudy with light winds from the NE, and a low near 56°.

2nd COVID-19 case in Lampasas County

The following was released by Lampasas County Judge Randy Hoyer yesterday:

Lampasas County – At noon today, I received word from Lampasas County Health Authority, Dr. Georgia Hay, that Lampasas County has its second confirmed case of COVID19. The individual is a female in her 50's who resides at the same household as the 1st confirmed case. She is not hospitalized and is at her residence in self-quarantine.

Health authorities are reporting that the next two weeks could show a significant increase in cases of COVID19 throughout the United States, including Texas. As citizens and residents of

Lampasas County, it is imperative that we adhere to the Shelter In Place Order, continue social/physical distancing, and wash your hands frequently. Please follow these and all recommendations from the CDC.

6 April 2020

The following was released by the City of Lampasas Monday Evening.

“City Extends COVID-19 Disaster Declaration”

In a short meeting Monday night, the Lampasas City Council voted unanimously to extend the City's COVID-19 Disaster declaration through April 30th. The Declaration was scheduled to expire on April 3rd but was extended by Mayor Talbert through April 6th for full Council consideration. The City Declaration now remains in effect consistent with the term of Governor Abbott's Statewide Order regarding continuation of essential services and activities. Similar to Governor Abbott's Order, the City Declaration defines essential businesses, services, and activities, and encourages residents to stay home and stay safe. City Council also reviewed current utility payment fees for credit card and on-line processing and chose not to waive those fees at

The Blotter

Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Monday shows an early morning reported harassment in the 200 block of N. Key at 12:13am, then suspicious persons were reported, one in the 500 block of E. North at 12:24am and one in the 100 block of N. Main at 12:26am. A shots fired call came in from the 200 block of W. 3rd St. at 1:48am, and a possession of drug paraphernalia was reported at the intersection of 183S and CR 4006 at 2:29am. There was a reported criminal mischief in the 2300 block of 580W at 7:41am, and there was a DWI in the 400 block of N. Key at 10:06am. The afternoon shows a theft reported in the 300 block of E. 4th St at 3:15pm, there was a reported harassment in the 1400 block of S. Chestnut at 4:31pm, then a noise complaint in the 1800 block of E. Ave F at 5:45pm. A harassment was reported in the 200 block of Landon Dr. at 6:55pm, then a reported theft in the 600 block of S. Western at 7:20pm. A shots fired report was called in from the 900 block of McLean St. at 7:38pm.

The Sheriff's Dept. Blotter for Monday shows Lometa with a reported trespassing call. Kempner shows medical calls, a reported theft, animal issues, a civil matter, a reported disturbance and a welfare check. Out in the county there was an accident, medical calls, and a noise complaint. Deputies went into Cove for an accident, a report of suspicious activity and a reported trespassing.

The Burn Ban has been lifted indefinitely

this time. "The City has suspended all late fees, notification fees, and will not cut utilities off during the COVID disaster, and staff has been able to extend payment options for our customers," said Mayor Misti Talbert. "We understand some customers have been impacted greatly by these events, and we want to keep options open to change our fee structure in the future if conditions do not improve," added Talbert. In related business, based on staff's recommendation, Council directed that the Hancock Park Golf Course remain closed, and that remote or parking lot Religious Services be allowed to continue providing public safety directives are followed. *"The next two weeks will be critical in delaying any spread of the virus in the City. Our daily lives have been turned upside down, and it's more important than ever to keep social distancing, wash hands frequently, not gather in groups of 10 or more people, and stay at home as much as possible,"* said Finley deGraffenried, City Manager.

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court met this morning for a brief meeting.

The wording on the shelter in place order concerning the size of the group allowed was clarified to state no group of "more than 10" are allowed to meet. The other change regarded religious worship services that will be allowed in the County *in strict compliance with social/physical distancing of all service providers and participants*. This will allow the churches to hold drive-in worship services as long as they are in compliance with the social distancing directives.

County Judge Randy Hoyer wishes to remind every citizen of the County to adhere to the spirit of the Order:

*Stay Home Stay Safe, unless you work at an essential business or have an essential need to leave your house, stay home!

*Practice Social/Physical Distancing, assume everyone you meet or see could be a carrier of the COVID 19 virus, and maintain a safe distance from one another.

*Wash your hands frequently and avoid touching your face, nose, or eyes. Use a hand sanitizer after touching surface tops, countertops, etc. Especially in public places.

*Change and wash your clothing after being in public locations.

*Remove yourself from any groups larger than 10 people.

*Use your elbow if you cough or sneeze.

*If you feel ill, remain at home and contact your medical healthcare provider.

*And Last, avoid travel outside of Lampasas County and especially, outside of Texas.
